Violations of the Israeli Occupation Army

- Israeli navy ships attacked Palestinian fishing boats with live fire and fired many gas bombs at Palestinians vacationing at the beach in northern Gaza. The navy ships fired many live rounds and gas bombs at several Palestinian fishing boats working in the Sudaniyya Sea, Al-Waha, and Beit Lahia. The attacks did not lead to casualties but forced the fishermen to return to the shore without being able to fish to provide for their families. Furthermore, the navy fired many gas bombs and smoke grenades at the Beit Lahia costs, where hundreds of Palestinians were vacationing, forcing them to leave. (IMEMC 1 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers injured a child and caused many Palestinians to suffer the effects of tear gas inhalation during the weekly nonviolent procession against the illegal colonies in Beit Dajan, east of Nablus, in the northern West Bank. Dozens of Palestinians gathered on their lands and nonviolently marched while chanting against Israel's ongoing land theft and illegal annexations to build and expand its colonies. The Palestinians chanted for the liberation of Palestine and in support of the detainees in Israeli prisons facing constant violations. The soldiers fired many rubber-coated steel bullets, gas bombs, and concussion grenades at the Palestinians to force them to leave their lands. The soldiers shot a child with a gas bomb in the arm and caused many Palestinians to suffer the effects of tear gas inhalation. (IMEMC 2 June 2023)
- Several foreign activists were detained as Israeli forces suppressed a peaceful event demanding the reopening and rehabilitation of Carmel-Tawana road in Masafer Yatta in the south of the occupied West Bank, according to local activist Osama Makhamreh. (Wafa 2 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers attacked many Palestinians and international activists and abducted two internationals during a nonviolent procession demanding the army to reopen a vital road south of Hebron in the southern part of the occupied West Bank. The Palestinians and international marched in Masafer Yatta, demanding the army to reopen the road before the soldiers attacked them. The soldiers prevented local council workers from rehabilitating and reopening the road and assaulted nonviolent activists before detaining two internationals. (IMEMC 2 June 2023)

- The soldiers also invaded Yatta town, south of Hebron, and installed roadblocks in several parts of the governorate before stopping and searching dozens of cars. (IMEMC 2 June 2023)
- In the Northern Plains of the Jordan Valley in the West Bank, the soldiers invaded Um Al-Jammal community and confiscated a car owned by Omar Khaled Amer. (IMEMC 2 June 2023)
- The Israeli soldiers invaded Faqqu'a, Arbouna, and Al-Jalama and conducted extensive searches. Protests occurred in Al-Jalama after the soldiers installed a roadblock at the village entrance, searched cars, and interrogated the Palestinians while inspecting their ID cards.
- The Israeli occupation forces re-closed one of the two main entrances to Al-Mughayyer village, east of Ramallah, two days after reopening it, according to local sources. They told WAFA that the occupation forces re-closed the western entrance to the village and prevented the movement of people through it, forcing them to take other longer and rough roads to reach their destinations. The occupation forces closed the village's two main entrances for 19 days before opening the western entrance on Thursday while keeping the eastern entrance closed. It is noteworthy that the occupation forces last week handed a local resident a notice to confiscate five dunums of his land, located at the eastern entrance to the village, under the pretext of constructing a military watchtower on his land, and also handed another resident a notice to stop work and construction in an agricultural facility and a sheep pen, also in the eastern side of the village. Meanwhile, the Israeli military closed this morning the Beit Furik military checkpoint, east of the northern West Bank city of Nablus, and prevented people from crossing it, causing a serious traffic jam. The checkpoint is located on the only access road for the villages of Beit Furik and nearby Beit Dajan. (WAFA 3 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers invaded Qabatia town, south of Jenin in the northern part of the occupied West Bank, and injured several Palestinians during ensuing protests. Several armored military vehicles invaded various neighborhoods in the town and closed several streets, leading to protests. The invading soldiers fired rubber-coated steel bullets, gas bombs, and concussion grenades, many striking homes. Many Palestinians, including children, suffered the effects of tear gas inhalation and received the needed treatment. The soldiers also invaded the towns and villages of Mothalath

Ash-Shuhada, Arraba, Bir Al-Basha, and Kafrit near Jenin. (IMEMC 3 June 2023)

- Israeli soldiers injured many Palestinians in Jalboun village, northeast of Jenin, in the northern part of the occupied West Bank. The soldiers invaded the village before storming the eastern cemetery and conducting extensive searches. The soldiers fired a barrage of gas bombs and concussion grenades at the Palestinians who protested the invasion, causing many to suffer the effects of tear gas inhalation. The soldiers also invaded the villages of Arbouna, Ta'nak, and Faqqu' and searched neighborhoods and lands. (IMEMC 3 June 2023)
- A Palestinian child was injured after an Israeli army jeep rammed him in Beit Furik town, east of Nablus in the northern West Bank. The child, Zein Salem Hanani, 14, suffered various cuts and bruises before Palestinian medics rushed him to a hospital in Nablus. The child was injured after several Israeli military jeeps invaded Beit Furik as schoolchildren left their schools when the school day was done. The invasion led to protests before the soldiers fired many live rounds, gas bombs, and concussion grenades. (IMEMC 4 June 2023)
- Israeli occupation forces last night brutally assaulted a Palestinian young man and confiscated the recordings of CCTV cameras during a raid in the village of Nabi Saleh, to the northwest of Ramallah, according to local sources. Bilal Tamimi, a local activist, told WAFA that Israeli occupation soldiers brutally assaulted and beat up Nidal Tamimi, a 35-year-old young man, after savagely raiding his home in the village. The young man was detained for several hours by the Israeli soldiers before he was let go. Meantime, Israeli occupation soldiers raided several shops in the village and confiscated the recordings of CCTV cameras. (WAFA 4 June 2023)
- In related news, the soldiers invaded Ya'bad town and Jalboun village, near the northern West Bank city of Jenin, stopped and searched Palestinian cars, and interrogated many Palestinians while inspecting their ID cards. The soldiers also invaded orchards in the Ya'bad Meadow area and fired many flares while conducting extensive searches. Furthermore, many army vehicles invaded Faqqu'a village, northeast of Jenin, and exchanged fire with Palestinian fighters at the Al-Jalama military roadblock northeast of the city. (IMEMC 4 June 2023)

- A Palestinian child suffered bruises after he was run over by an Israeli military vehicle during an Israeli raid in the town of Beit Furik, to the east of Nablus in the occupied West Bank, according to witnesses. Zain Salem Hanani, 14, was hit and run by an Israeli military vehicle during the raid, and was rushed to a nearby hospital where he is being treated for bruises. The child is in a stable health condition. Confrontations erupted between Israeli occupation forces and residents shortly after the Israeli army broke into the town at noon. The Israeli raid coincided with the time children were leaving their schools. (Wafa 4 June 2023)
- In Nablus, in the northern West Bank, the soldiers invaded Beit Furik town, east of the city, leading to protests, and fired gas bombs and concussion grenades at students near their schools. (IMEMC 4 June 2023)
- In an unprecedented move, Israeli occupation forces this evening deployed military armored vehicles in lands located behind the segregation barrier near the village of Aqaba and the town of Qaffin, north of Tulkarem, in the northern occupied West Bank, according to a local official. Head of Aqaba village council, Taysir Amarneh, told Wafa that artillery and armored vehicles were positioned and heavily-armed soldiers were deployed in lands located only 50 meters behind the barrier. The official noted that these lands belong to the village residents and are planted with olive trees. (Wafa 4 June 2023)
- In addition, the soldiers invaded Nur Shams refugee camp, east of Tulkarem in the northeastern West Bank, after Palestinian fighters opened fire at army vehicles near the refugee camp. (IMEMC 4 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers shot a Palestinian worker near a section of the illegal Annexation Wall in Qalqilia, in the northwestern West Bank. The worker was trying to cross a breach in the Wall to head to his work inside the Greenline when the soldiers opened fire at him. The soldiers shot the worker with a live round in the leg near the Wall before he was rushed to a hospital in Qalqilia. The wounded worker is from Iskaka village, east of Salfit, in the central part of the occupied West Bank. (IMEMC 4 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers invaded Nabi Saleh village, north of Ramallah in the central part of the occupied West Bank, assaulted and injured a young man, and confiscated surveillance recordings from several shops they stormed and ransacked. The soldiers invaded the home of Nidal Tamimi, 35, and ransacked the property while repeatedly assaulting him, causing various injuries. The soldiers detained Nidal for a few hours despite his wounds

before releasing him. Many Palestinians protested the invasion before the soldiers fired concussion grenades and gas bombs and occupied rooftops to use as firing posts. The soldiers broke into and ransacked several shops in the village and confiscated surveillance recordings. (IMEMC 4 June 2023)

- Israeli forces assaulted a Palestinian woman and detained four other youths during a raid into the refugee camp of Aqabat Jabr and the occupied West Bank city of Jericho, security sources confirmed. The sources told Wafa that the Israeli forces broke into the camp and detained Mu'ayyad al-Sajdi after raiding and ransacking his house. Additionally, the forces detained three others from the city of Jericho and assaulted an elderly Palestinian woman. (Wafa 5 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers injured many Palestinians in several villages and towns in the Jenin governorate and several Palestinians in Nablus, in the West Bank's northern part. The soldiers invaded the villages and towns of 'Arraba, Kafr Ra'ey, Fahma, Rommana, and Zabbouba, near Jenin, leading to protests. The soldiers fired live rounds, gas bombs, and concussion grenades at the Palestinians, causing many to suffer the effects of tear gas inhalation. The soldiers also installed roadblocks around many villages and towns south of Jenin, stopped and searched many cars, and interrogated dozens of Palestinians while inspecting their ID cards. In related news, the soldiers shot one Palestinian with a rubber-coated steel bullet and caused many to suffer the effects of tear gas inhalation after the army invaded Beit Furik town, east of Nablus. The soldiers also confiscated a bulldozer in the Khirbat Tana area in Beit Furik town and abducted its driver. (IMEMC 6 June 2023)
- Israeli occupation forces uprooted 50 olive trees and destroyed a retaining wall in the town of Hizma, northeast of occupied Jerusalem, according to local sources. The trees and the wall belong to different residents of the town. The forces also destroyed several agricultural roads. (Wafa 6 June 2023)
- A seriously wounded Palestinian child whom Israeli soldiers shot last Thursday in Nabi Saleh village, northwest of the central West Bank city of Ramallah, succumbed to his wounds. The child, Mohammad Haitham Tamimi, 3 years of age, was shot in the head, and his father was shot in the shoulder last Thursday while standing in the front yard of their home near an Israeli military roadblock at the entrance of Nabi Saleh. The seriously wounded child was rushed to Tal HaShomer Israeli Medical Center, where he was treated for his wounds but remained in critical condition until he

succumbed to his injuries. The child's corpse was transferred to Palestine Medical Complex In Ramallah ahead of the funeral ceremony and burial procession that would be held Tuesday. A Palestinian child was critically injured and his father suffered serious wounds after Israeli soldiers fired live rounds at them near an Israeli military roadblock at the entrance of Nabi Saleh village, northwest of the central West Bank city of Ramallah. (MEMC 6 June 2023)

- Israeli soldiers invaded a mosque in Deir Sharaf town, west of Nablus, in the northern part of the occupied West Bank. The soldiers invaded the town before storming the Abu Bakr Al-Siddeeq Mosque before searching it. The soldiers summoned the Mosque's Imam for interrogation and searched many nearby storage rooms. The soldiers also intensified their deployment at the town's main entrance and junction leading to Jenin and Tulkarem and placed concrete blocks to close it. (MEMC 7 June 2023)
- Many Israeli military vehicles invaded Kafr Dan town, west of the northern West Bank city of Jenin, shot a young man, abducted four from their homes, and detonated a Palestinian car. The soldiers stormed and ransacked many homes in the town, causing excessive damage, and interrogated many Palestinians while inspecting their ID cards. The soldiers abducted Malek Mohammad Aabed, Ehsan Ayman 'Aabed and his brother Osama, and former political prisoner Mojahed Ahmad Salah. The soldiers also detonated a car owned by the father of Ehsan and Osama and caused excessive damage during violent searches of the home. Many Palestinians protested the invasion before the soldiers fired live rounds, rubber-coated steel bullets, and gas bombs. One Palestinian suffered a shrapnel wound from a bullet in the leg, and many suffered the effects of tear gas inhalation. (MEMC 7 June 2023)
- Many Israeli army vehicles invaded the Aqabat Jaber refugee camp, south of Jericho in the northeastern West Bank, and shot six Palestinians during ensuing protests. The Palestinian Red Crescent Society (PRCS) has confirmed that the soldiers shot six Palestinians with live rounds in the lower extremities and obstructed the arrival of medics and ambulances by closing the entire area. The Palestinians were injured after dozens of soldiers invaded the refugee camp and initiated massive and violent invasions and searches of homes, causing property damage. The soldiers did not only target protesters with live rounds, rubber-coated steel bullets,

and gas bombs but also many homes in the invaded refugee camp. (IMEMC 7 June 2023)

- Israeli soldiers injured many Palestinians, including one shot with a live round, after the funeral ceremony of a child whom Israeli soldiers killed. Hundreds of Palestinians participated in the funeral ceremony and procession of the slain child, Mohammad Haitham Tamimi, 3. The soldiers shot a young man with a live round in the leg. The soldiers also shot another young man with a rubber-coated steel bullet in the face, and caused many Palestinians to suffer the effects of tear gas inhalation. It is worth mentioning that the slain child, Mohammad, died from serious wounds Monday after Israeli soldiers shot him a week earlier in Nabi Saleh. The child was shot in the head, and his father was shot in the shoulder last Thursday while standing in the front yard of their home near an Israeli military roadblock at the entrance of Nabi Saleh. The seriously wounded child was rushed to Tal HaShomer Israeli Medical Center, where he was treated for his wounds but remained in critical condition until he succumbed to his injuries. In Hebron, in the southern part of the West Bank, the soldiers caused many Palestinians to suffer the effects of tear gas inhalation in Beit Ummar town, north of the city. The soldiers fired many gas bombs and concussion grenades at Palestinians protesting the closure of the town's main entrance. (IMEMC 7 June 2023)
- Israeli occupation forces attacked Palestinian houses and seized an excavator in Zweidin community, east of Yatta city, in the southern occupied West Bank, according to a local activist. The heavily-armed soldiers stormed the community and showered the houses with tear gas canisters, causing several to suffocate. The soldiers rounded up a resident of the community and seized an excavator used in the course of land reclamation works, close to Zif locality. (Wafa 8 June 2023)
- At least three Palestinians were shot and injured, while dozens of others suffocated as Israeli forces attacked the weekly anti-settlement rally in the village of Kafr Qaddoum to the east of Qalqilia, according to local sources. Sources informed Wafa Israeli army attacked the march with rubber-coated metal bullets and tear gas canisters, leading to confrontations. Three people were shot and injured with rubber rounds, while dozens of others were reportedly treated at the scene from tear gas suffocation. (Wafa 9 June 2023)

- The Palestinian Health Ministry in Gaza confirmed the death of an elder who was seriously injured during Israel's offensive on Gaza last Month. The elder, Ismael Salman Ayyad, 73, was seriously injured when an Israeli war jet fired a missile near his home in the Zeitoun neighborhood, east of Gaza City. Ismael was seriously injured on May 12 and underwent several surgeries due to the seriousness of his wounds, but he remained in critical condition until he succumbed to his wounds. (IMEMC 9 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers killed a young Palestinian man at the Rantis military roadblock west of Ramallah in the central part of the occupied West Bank. The soldiers killed Mahdi Samir Mohammad Bayadsa, 29, at the military roadblock. The soldiers refused to allow Palestinian medics to approach the roadblock before the army informed the Palestinian General Authority of Civil Affairs that the soldiers fatally shot Mahdi. According to Israeli sources, the Palestinian arrived at the roadblock and tried to snatch the weapon from a soldier before stabbing him. According to the army, the Mahdi arrived in a stolen car at the roadblock and attacked the soldiers who tried to inspect the vehicle, mildly wounding one before the soldiers fatally shot him. The army added that it is investigating the circumstances of the incident to determine whether the attack was "nationally motivated or a criminal offense." After killing the young man, the soldiers closed the roadblock and forced the Palestinians to leave the area. (IMEMC 9 June 2023)
- Israeli occupation forces attacked Palestinian houses and seized an excavator in the Zweidin community, east of Yatta city, in the southern occupied West Bank, according to a local activist. The heavily-armed soldiers stormed the community and showered the houses with tear gas canisters, causing several to suffocate. The soldiers rounded up a resident of the community and seized an excavator used in the course of land reclamation works close to the Zif locality. The Palestinians in the Zweidin area, which includes the communities of Arab As-Saray'a, An-Najada, Al-Hathalin, and Ad-Deerat, continue their struggle against the seriously escalating Israeli violations, including the attempts to displace them for the benefit in illegal construction and expansion of the Israeli colonies, in violation of International Law. (IMEMC 9 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers abducted a Palestinian and confiscated a bulldozer near Nablus and Qalqilia in the occupied West Bank. The soldiers abducted Abdullah Mahmoud Al-Jarboa', from Jenin while crossing the Za'tara

military roadblock south of Nablus in the northern West Bank. The soldiers stopped and searched many cars and interrogated several Palestinian while inspecting their ID cards before abducting Abdullah. In Qalqilia, in the northwestern West Bank, the soldiers invaded Kafr Thulth village, south of the city, and confiscated a bulldozer owned by Amir Gharaba while rehabilitating lands owned by Ibrahim Hammad to prepare them for planting. The army claimed the Palestinians must obtain permits before working on their lands in the area, especially since it is in Area C of the occupied West Bank. (IMEMC 10 June 2023)

- Israeli soldiers injured many Palestinians in Husan village, west of Bethlehem, in the occupied West Bank. The soldiers invaded many areas in Husan, leading to protests, especially in the al-Mateina area. The soldiers fired many gas bombs and concussion grenades, causing many Palestinians to suffer the effects of tear gas inhalation. Palestinian medics treated the injured for their wounds without needing to hospitalize them. (IMEMC 10 June 2023)
- In Kufur Qaddoum, east of Qalqilia, the soldiers shot three Palestinians with rubber-coated steel bullets and caused many to suffer the effects of tear gas inhalation. The Palestinians hold weekly processions in Kufur Qaddoum, demanding the army to reopen the town's main entrance, blockaded 19 years ago to allow easy access to illegal colonizers driving to and from Kedumim colony, built on stolen Palestinians. (IMEMC 10 June 2023)
- In Beit Ummar town, north of Hebron, in the southern part of the West Bank, the soldiers shot two Palestinians with rubber-coated steel bullets and caused many to suffer the effects of tear gas inhalation after the army closed the town's main entrance during a funeral procession, leading to protests. (IMEMC 10 June 2023)
- In Nablus, in the northern West Bank, the soldiers caused fifteen Palestinians to suffer the effects of tear gas inhalation during the weekly procession against the illegal colonies in Beit Dajan, east of the city. The Palestinians have been holding ongoing processions on their lands in Sbeih Mountain in Beita and Beit Dajan after a group of illegal Israeli colonizers installed an outpost atop the Mountain. (IMEMC 10 June 2023)

- Israeli soldiers injured a Palestinian mother and her child in the Sheikh Ammar area, southeast of Deir Dibwan town, east of Ramallah in the central West Bank. Several army vehicles invaded the area and fired many gas bombs and shepherds' tents and at a tent set up by young men on their lands to fend off attacks by illegal colonizers who constantly attempt to occupy them. A Palestinian woman and her child suffered the severe effects of tear gas inhalation before being rushed to a local clinic. The soldiers also fired many flares resulting in burning Palestinian farmlands in the town before firefighters rushed to the area and extinguished the fire. (IMEMC 10 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers abducted eight Palestinians from several parts of the occupied West Bank; the army also injured many Palestinians near Bethlehem. The soldiers invaded Husan town, west of Bethlehem, searched homes, and abducted Nour Taiseer Hamamra, 16, and Mohammad Nader Sabateen, 18. Many youngsters protested the invasion and abductions before the soldiers fired gas bombs and concussion grenades, causing dozens of Palestinians, mainly in their homes, to suffer the effects of tear gas inhalation. (IMEMC 11 June 2023)
- In Jenin, in the northern West Bank, the soldiers abducted Abdullah Omar Zeid from his home in Nazlet Sheikh village, Ghanem Bassam Hamarsha, Abboud Ja'far Taher, and Abed Mohammad Hamarsha. The army also invaded Ya'bad town, west of Jenin, and ransacked the homes of a former political prisoner, Tareq Kabaha, in addition to Ali Amarna, leading to protests before the soldiers fired many gas bombs and concussion grenades. (IMEMC 11 June 2023)
- In Hebron, in the southern part of the West Bank, the soldiers abducted Fathi Sharabati from As-Sahla Street after dozens of paramilitary Israeli colonies attacked Palestinians, their homes, and stores. In occupied Jerusalem, the army abducted a teenage boy, Mohammad Yasser Darwish, from his home in Al-Isawiya town. (IMEMC 11 June 2023)
- Several Israeli military vehicles invaded Nablus, in the northern part of the occupied West Bank, shot a young man, and abducted four, including a father and his son, from their homes. The army invaded the Old City area of Nablus before storming homes and ransacking them. Many Palestinians protested the invasion before the soldiers shot a young man with a live round in the leg. The soldiers also invaded homes in several villages and

- towns south of Nablus and abducted Qoteiba Mohammad Hamayel and Abdul-Majid Issa Haymayel in Beita town, Rashad Shahin and his son, Rayyan, 14, from their homes in Qaryout village. (IMEMC 12 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers shot a young man and caused many Palestinians to suffer the effects of tear gas inhalation in Zababda town, south of Jenin, in the northern part of the occupied West Bank. Several army vehicles invaded the town, leading to protests before the soldiers fired live rounds, rubber-coated steel bullets, and gas bombs. The soldiers shot a young man with a live round and caused many Palestinians to suffer the effects of tear gas inhalation. The soldiers also invaded Rommana town, west of Jenin, leading to protests, and fired several live rounds and gas bombs. (IMEMC 12 June 2023)
 - One Palestinian fisherman was shot after Israeli navy ships attacked Palestinian fishing boats near the shore of Gaza City. The navy fired many rubber-coated steel bullets and gas bombs at Palestinian fishing boats in the Sudaniyya Sea area, northwest of Gaza City. One fisherman was shot with a rubber-coated steel bullet and was moved to the Shifa Medical Center in Gaza. The navy also used water cannons and high-velocity gas bombs, forcing the fishermen to leave without being able to fish to provide for their families. (IMEMC 13 June 2023)
 - In Jenin, in the northern West Bank, the soldiers invaded Rommana village and installed a roadblock at its main entrance before searching many cars and interrogating scores of Palestinians while inspecting their ID cards. The army invaded Al-Jalama near Jenin. (IMEMC 13 June 2023)
 - Israeli soldiers confiscated a Palestinian bulldozer and a vehicle while fixing a broken water pipeline on the main Jerusalem-Hebron road in Beit Ummar town, north of Hebron. (IMEMC 13 June 2023)
 - The Israeli navy abducted, after midnight Wednesday, five Palestinian fishermen including a child and seized their fishing boat off the northern coast of the besieged Gaza Strip. After midnight, on the al-Waha shore, northwest of Beit Lahia, in the northern part of the Gaza Strip, Israeli Navy boats surrounded a Palestinian fishing boat that was sailing within the limits set for fishing by the occupation. The Navy abducted all five fishermen aboard and confiscated the fishing boat belonging to fisherman Omar Ibrahim al-Habeel, 70. Israeli forces abducted 5 fishermen including

a minor, they were identified as; Mohammed Omar al-Habeel, 37, *his son Omar*, 16, Jihad Mahmoud al-Habeel, 24, Hasan Fadel Baker, 36, and Sadam Majed Baker, 32. (IMEMC 14 June 2023)

- Israeli soldiers killed a young Palestinian man and injured eight, including a child, after many army vehicles invaded the Balata refugee camp east of Nablus in the northern part of the occupied West Bank. The soldiers shot Fares Abdul-Mon'em Mohammad Hashash, 19, after shooting him with live rounds in the chest, abdomen, and legs. Palestinian medics rushed Fares to Rafidia governmental hospital, but he succumbed to his serious wounds. The soldiers shot eight with live fire, including a child, and added that four injured Palestinians suffered life-threatening wounds. The soldiers prevented Palestinian medics from entering the refugee camp and fired live rounds at an ambulance trying to reach wounded Palestinians. The medics were only allowed to enter the refugee camp and reach the wounded after coordination by the International Committee of the Red Cross, which contacted the Israeli side. In addition, the soldiers surrounded a home in the refugee camp and threatened to detonate it if the Palestinians did not leave the property, in addition to storming and ransacking many surrounding homes and detaining the families. The invasion started when undercover soldiers infiltrated the refugee camp wearing press vests, but the locals noticed them before an Israeli army sharpshooter on a rooftop of an invaded home shot and seriously injured a teenage boy, identified as Tha'er Hashash, whose flesh was scattered on nearby walls and doors. Furthermore, the soldiers assaulted and injured a Palestinian man and his wife in the Askar refugee camp, east of Nablus, before the medics rushed them to a hospital in the city. Also, the army invaded Tal Street in Nablus city before storming a building and taking measurements of the family home of Moath Al-Masri, in preparation for demolishing it. (IMEMC 14 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers invaded many homes and shops and closed roads with sand hills before abducting five Palestinians in Ya'bad town, southwest of Jenin, in the northern part of the occupied West Bank. The town's invasion lasted several hours, during which the soldiers stormed and ransacked many homes and shops. The soldiers abducted Mahmoud Abbadi and Ahmad Nasser Abbadi from their homes in the Al-Malloul neighborhood but released him a few hours later. The soldiers abducted Rami Tawfiq Abu Bakr, Mustafa Shawqi Abbadi, and former political prisoner Ahmad Jawad Abu Bakr and took them to an unknown destination. It is worth mentioning

that many army vehicles invaded the town in the evening, closed the Dotan military roadblock, and installed many roadblocks after a shooting attack in the area. The soldiers installed sandhills between Ya'bad and Imreiha and several dirt roads before surrounding and isolating Ya'bad. The army then stormed and ransacked many homes and shops, interrogated scores of Palestinians, and confiscated surveillance recordings and equipment. According to Israeli sources, three soldiers suffered moderate wounds, and one was mildly injured in a shooting attack by Palestinian fighters near Ya'bad. An Israeli colonizer was also moderately injured after being shot in a separate incident near the location of the first shooting. The colonizer was shot when his car came under fire between Ya'bad and the Mevo Dotan military roadblock. (IMEMC 14 June 2023)

- Israeli soldiers killed a Palestinian and injured 185, including three who suffered life-threatening wounds, when dozens of soldiers invaded Nablus, in the northern West Bank, before wiring and detonating a Palestinian home. The family lived on the fourth floor of a five-story building inhabited by eight Palestinian families. The soldiers removed all families from the building and all surrounding homes and properties before wiring the fourth floor and detonating it several hours into the invasion. The soldiers killed a young man, *Khalil Yahia Al-Anis*, 20, from the Al-Ein refugee camp, in addition to shooting and seriously injuring three with live fire. (IMEMC 15 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers killed a Palestinian and injured 185, including three who suffered life-threatening wounds, when dozens of soldiers invaded Nablus, in the northern West Bank, before wiring and detonating a Palestinian home. The family lived on the fourth floor of a five-story building inhabited by eight Palestinian families. The soldiers removed all families from the building and all surrounding homes and properties before wiring the fourth floor and detonating it several hours into the invasion. The soldiers killed a young man, *Khalil Yahia Al-Anis*, 20, from the Al-Ein refugee camp, in addition to shooting and seriously injuring three with live fire. (IMEMC 15 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers injured a young Palestinian woman during an invasion of Ya'bad town, southwest of Jenin in the northern part of the occupied West Bank. The soldiers invaded the town, which has been surrounded for the last two days, and stopped and searched many cars in the An-Nab'a area while interrogating many Palestinians and inspecting their ID cards. Many

Palestinians protested the invasion before the soldiers fired live rounds, rubber-coated steel bullets, gas bombs, and concussion grenades. A young woman suffered shrapnel wounds in her home, and many Palestinians suffered the effects of tear gas inhalation. The soldiers also stormed and ransacked many homes and shops, occupied rooftops to use as firing posts and monitoring towers, and installed military roadblocks. It is worth mentioning that the army placed sand barriers on many roads leading to Ya'bad town and confiscated surveillance recordings from homes and stores. In related news, undercover Israeli soldiers driving a car with Palestinian license plates kidnapped a young man, Mojahed Abu Khalifa, at the Jenin city's western entrance. (IMEMC 15 June 2023)

- Israeli soldiers stationed across the perimeter fence fired many live rounds at Palestinian farmers east of Khan Younis, in the southern part of the Gaza Strip. The soldiers fired sporadic rounds of live ammunition at the farmers and their lands east of the Al-Fakhari area, east of Khan Younis. The attacks did not lead to casualties but forced the farmers to leave their lands, fearing further violations. Such attacks repeatedly target farmers, workers, and shepherds on their lands near the fence along the eastern parts of the besieged Gaza Strip. (IMEMC 16 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers invaded the Jenin city and Jenin refugee camp in the northern West Bank city of Jenin, leading to protests, and shot a young man with a live round. Many army vehicles invaded Jenin city and Jenin refugee camp, leading to protests before the army fired many live rounds, rubber-coated steel bullets, and gas bombs. The soldiers shot a young man in the arm before the medics rushed him to Ibn Sina Specialized Hospital. Also, Palestinian fighters exchanged fire with the soldiers and detonated explosive charges near military vehicles in Jenin and the Jenin refugee camp. (IMEMC 17 June 2023)
- Israeli occupation forces opened fire at Palestinians attending to their lands east of the city of Khan Younis, in the south of the Gaza Strip. The shooting forced the farmers to stop work on their land and leave it to avoid being injured or killed. Opening fire at Gaza farmers working in their lands near the border fence with Israel is an almost daily occurrence. (Wafa 17 June 2023)
- Israeli occupation forces assaulted and arrested a Palestinian child during an Israeli military raid in the town of Arraba, in the northern West Bank province of Jenin, according to Palestinian security sources. 13-year-old

- Mohammad Shahin Arda was brutally assaulted by Israeli occupation soldiers who arrested him under the pretext of filming them as they stormed the town. The child was taken to an unknown destination. (Wafa 17 June 2023)
- A number of Palestinians suffocated Sunday evening during confrontations with the Israeli occupation forces in Silat al-Harithiya town, west of the occupied West Bank city of Jenin. Security sources told Wafa that confrontations broke out with the occupation forces at the entrance to the town, during which a number of citizens suffered from tear gas suffocation. The occupation soldiers set up a military checkpoint on Jenin-Haifa Street at the entrance to the town of al-Yamoun, and inspected citizens' vehicles. (Wafa 18 June 2023)
 - A number of Palestinians suffocated Sunday evening during confrontations with the Israeli occupation forces in the village of Burqa, northwest of the occupied West Bank city of Nablus. Confrontations broke out with the occupation forces stormed Burqa, and fired bullets and tear gas canisters, which led to the injury of a number of citizens. A group of settlers attacked citizens' vehicles with stones at the entrance to the village, on the road between Jenin and Nablus. (Wafa 18 June 2023)
 - Israeli soldiers have killed five Palestinians, including a child, and injured at least 100, including 23 who suffered life-threatening wounds, in Jenin and the Jenin refugee camp, in the northern part of the occupied West Bank. The soldiers killed, in Jenin, **Ahmad Khaled Daraghma**, 19, from Tubas, in the northeastern West Bank. The Palestinians who were killed by the army earlier Monday have been identified as **Ahmad Yousef Saqer**, 15, **Khaled Azzam Asa'sa**, 21, **Qassam Faisal Abu Seriyya**, 29, and **Qais Majdi Adel Jabarin**, 21. The soldiers injured at least 100 Palestinians, including 23 who suffered critical wounds. (IMEMC 19 June 2023)
 - Two Palestinians sustained wounds from Israeli army gunfire close to Tura village, southwest of the occupied West Bank city of Jenin. The occupation forces unleashed a barrage of gunfire on a vehicle near the village, leaving two Palestinians wounded, including a critical injury. The soldiers prevented medics from approaching the scene. (Wafa 19 June 2023)
 - Israeli occupation forces targeted Palestinian journalists while covering the ongoing Israeli aggression on the city of Jenin and its camp. Hafiz Abu Sabra, a journalist, told Wafa that Israeli forces directly opened gunfire at his vehicle while he was covering the assault near the entrance of the camp, causing damage. The soldiers also opened fire at Hazem Nasser, a

photojournalist at al-Ghad TV channel. The killing of four Palestinians, including a child, while 45 others were wounded, 10 of them in critical condition. (Wafa 19 June 2023)

- A Palestinian who was shot and seriously injured by Israeli army fire Monday during the massive Israeli invasion of Jenin, leading to five deaths and more than 100 injuries; the soldiers killed his son on January 26, 2023. Amjad Aref Al-Ja'as, 48, from Jenin refugee camp, was one of many Palestinians who suffered serious wounds Monday and succumbed to his injuries. Due to the seriousness of his wounds, the Palestinian was rushed to a hospital in Jenin and was later moved to Rafidia Hospital in Nablus. It is worth mentioning that Amjad is the father of Wasim Amjad Aref Al-Ja'as, 19, who was among nine Palestinians, including one woman and siblings, killed by Israeli army fire in the Jenin refugee camp on January 26, 2023. (IMEMC 20 June 2023)
- A Palestinian youth was shot and killed by Israeli occupation forces during confrontations that broke out in the village of Husan, west of the occupied West Bank city of Bethlehem, the Ministry of Health confirmed. Zakaria Mohammad al-Za'oul, 20, was brought to a hospital in Husan with critical head wounds from Israeli army gunfire and was pronounced dead shortly after. Rami Hamamra, head of the Husan village council, told Wafa that confrontations broke out between the village youths and Israeli forces at the eastern entrance to the village. The soldiers fired live bullets and gas and sound canisters at the youths during the confrontations, critically injuring al-Za'oul in the head, who was rushed to hospital and was later pronounced dead. Two more youths were shot by Israeli gunfire, one in the stomach and the other in the neck, noting that one unidentified youth was also detained. (Wafa 20 June 2023)
- The Israeli occupation police last night broke into Islam's third holiest site, Al-Aqsa Mosque, in Jerusalem's Old City, and forced everyone there, including the official Waqf employees and the all-night worshippers, to leave the compound, according to witnesses. The police closed all gates to the walled holy compound and prevented people from entering it without giving any explanation for their actions. The women all-night worshippers decided to hold their vigil at the steps of Damascus Gate, the main gate to Jerusalem's Old City, in protest of the police action before the police also forced them to leave the area. The police act is believed related to keeping the Muslim holy compound empty of Palestinian worshippers when the

fanatic Jews start their morning provocative storming of Al-Aqsa Mosque. (WAFA 20 June 2023)

- Israeli soldiers killed a young Palestinian man and injured two after the army invaded Husan village, west of Bethlehem, in the occupied West Bank. He is the sixth Palestinian the soldiers killed in the West Bank since the early morning hours. Many army vehicles invaded the Al-Matina area at the eastern entrance of Husan, leading to protests before the soldiers fired live rounds, rubber-coated steel bullets, gas bombs, and concussion grenades. The soldiers killed Zakariya Mohammad Zakariya Za'oul, 20, after shooting him with a live round in the head. Palestinian medics rushed the young man to a hospital in Bethlehem but succumbed to his serious wounds. The soldiers also shot two Palestinians, one in the neck and one in the abdomen, and abducted another young man. (IMEMC 20 June 2023)
- A large Israeli army unit this morning raided the village of Orif, south of the northern West Bank city of Nablus, broke into several homes and detained five people, according to the head of Orif village council Abed al-Hamim Shehadeh. The soldiers broke into the homes of the two village residents who allegedly shot and killed four Israelis yesterday at an illegal settlement north of Ramallah before they were themselves shot and killed by soldiers, Muhannad Shehadeh and Khaled Sabah, and took measurements of their family homes in preparation to demolish them as part of Israel's collective punishment policy against the Palestinians. The soldiers also detained five people, members of the Shehadeh family or friends of the two slain Palestinians. (WAFA 21 June 2023)
- A Palestinian sustained shrapnel injuries from Israeli army gunfire in Kafr Malik town, northeast of Ramallah. A Palestinian young man was shot and injured in the head by live ammunition fired by Israeli soldiers in the course of confrontations in the village. The casualty was admitted to a hospital for a CT scan to determine the nature of his injury. (WAFA 21 June 2023)
- A Palestinian child was injured after an Israeli army jeep rammed him near Nablus, in the northern part of the occupied West Bank. The child, 15, was rushed to Rafidia Hospital in Nablus. The medics first treated the child for his wounds in the an-Nassariya town, east of Nablus, before moving him to the medical center. The child was injured when many army vehicles invaded the town, leading to protests before the soldiers fired live rounds,

rubber-coated steel bullets, and gas bombs and chased many Palestinians. (IMEMC 21 June 2023)

- A Palestinian man whom Israeli soldiers shot and seriously injured a month earlier in Jenin, in the northern part of the occupied West Bank died. Nasser Saleh Mohammad Sinan, 55, succumbed to serious wounds he suffered on May 22, when an Israeli soldier shot him with a live round in the head. The slain man was a married father of six children. Nasser underwent several surgeries due to his gunshot wound to the head but remained in serious condition until he succumbed to his wounds. (IMEMC 21 June 2023)
- A Palestinian child who suffered serious wounds after Israeli soldiers shot her during the military offensive in Jenin Monday succumbed to her injuries. The soldiers shot the child, Sadeel Ghassan Turkman, 15, from the Jenin refugee camp, with a live round to the head and remained in critical condition until she succumbed to her wounds. Her death brings the number of Palestinians killed by Israeli army fire in Jenin to seven, including two children. (IMEMC 21 June 2023)
- In Jenin, in the northern West Bank, undercover Israeli soldiers infiltrated Burqin town, southwest of the city, abducted Baha' Qassem Shalameesh, and repeatedly assaulted Mustafa Ahmad Shalameesh while interrogating him. Many Palestinians protested the invasion before the soldiers fired many live rounds, gas bombs, and concussion grenades, wounding a young man with live fire. The soldiers prevented Palestinian medics from reaching the wounded young man. Also, the soldiers installed a roadblock at the entrance of Ya'bad town, west of Jenin, stopped and searched dozens of cars, and interrogated many Palestinians while inspecting their ID cards. (IMEMC 22 June 2023)
- The Israeli soldiers invaded the Ar-Ram town, north of occupied Jerusalem, and caused many Palestinians to suffer the effects of tear gas inhalation during ensuing protests. (IMEMC 22 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers invaded the Deheishe refugee camp south of Bethlehem in the occupied West Bank, leading to protests, before the army shot a young man and abducted a teenage boy from his home. Several military jeeps invaded the refugee camp and fired live rounds, rubber-coated steel bullets, gas bombs, and concussion grenades at Palestinians who protested the invasion. The soldiers shot a young man with a live round in the arm before

Palestinian medics rushed him to a hospital in Bethlehem. The soldiers also invaded and searched several homes and abducted a teenage boy, Yazan Jabr Hasanat, 17. (IMEMC 22 June 2023)

- An Israeli military drone fired a missile at a car in Jenin, in the northern part of the occupied West Bank, killing three Palestinians, including a teenage boy. The slain Palestinians were identified as Soheib Adnan Al-Ghoul, 27, Mohammad Bashar Oweis, 28, and Ashraf Morad Sa'adi, 17. Ashraf was named after his uncle, Ashraf Mahmoud Nafe' Sa'adi, who the soldiers killed in the year 2006. Palestinian medics and firefighters rushed to the area of the attack, but the soldiers, who invaded Jenin, prevented them from approaching the targeted car. The army refused to allow Palestinian medics and firefighters to retrieve the corpses of the slain Palestinians and closed the Jenin-Nazareth Road. (IMEMC 22 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers attacked the weekly procession against the illegal colonialist activities in Sbeih Mountain in Beita town, south of the northern West Bank city of Nablus, Beit Dajan, east of Nablus, and abducted a child in nearby Douma village. Dozens of Palestinians marched in Beita and Beit Dajan and headed to Sbeih Mountain before the soldiers attacked them with live rounds, rubber-coated steel bullets, and gas bombs. Several Palestinians suffered the effects of tear gas inhalation, cuts, and bruises before the medics treated them. The soldiers attacked the protesters after dozens of colonizers, headed by the fanatic "National Security Minister," Itamar Bin-Gvir, invaded the mountain under heavy military deployment and called on the army and the Israeli government to initiate a large-scale offensive in the West Bank to kill what he called "thousands of terrorists." His statements in a press conference he held with the head of the so-called "Samaria Regional Council of Settlements," Yossi Dagan, and Daniella Weiss, the head of the fanatic colonialist movement "Nachala," which encourages the takeover of Palestinian lands to build and expand the illegal Israeli colonies. Also, the soldiers attacked the weekly procession against the colonialist activities in Beit Dajan, east of Nablus, and fired many rubber-coated steel bullets and gas bombs, causing many to suffer the effects of tear gas inhalation. The soldiers also invaded Douma village, south of Nablus, and abducted a child, Osama Bilal Salawda, at a carwash facility in the village and took him to an unknown destination. (IMEMC 23 June 2023)

- Several Palestinians suffocated by tear gas as Israeli forces violently suppressed the peaceful anti-settlement weekly march in the town of Beit Dejan to the east of Nablus. Forces attacked the march with rubber-coated steel bullets, tear gas canisters, and stun grenades, causing several people to suffocate from tear gas inhalation. They were all treated at the scene. Palestinians there have been protesting against the theft of Palestinian land for the benefit of settlement expansion. (Wafa 23 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers attacked the weekly procession in Kufur Qaddoum, east of Qalqilia in the northwestern West Bank, and injured many Palestinians. The Palestinians marched from the center of the town, carrying Palestinian flags and chanting against the serious escalation by the Israeli army and the paramilitary colonizers in the West Bank. The protesters called for continued popular struggle until liberty and independence despite the Israeli escalation against the Palestinians, their homes, lands, and their holy sites. The soldiers fired many rubber-coated steel bullets, gas bombs, and concussion grenades at the protesters and tried to ambush and abduct some of them. The soldiers shot four Palestinians with rubber-coated steel bullets and caused many to suffer the effects of tear gas inhalation. Many youngsters burnt tires and hurled stones at the soldiers who invaded the town and attacked the procession. (IMEMC 23 June 2023)
- Israeli military vehicles invaded the eastern area of Nablus, in the northern part of the occupied West Bank, leading to protests, before the soldiers shot two Palestinians, and abducted four from their homes. The soldiers fired many live rounds, rubber-coated steel bullets, gas bombs, and concussion grenades at the Palestinian protesters during ensuing protests. The soldiers shot two young men with live rounds, one in the neck and one in the shoulder before the medics rushed them to a hospital in Nablus. The medics also treated at least thirty Palestinians who suffered the effects of tear gas inhalation, lacerations, and bruises. Furthermore, the soldiers stormed and ransacked many homes before abducting four young men, Amer Al-Masri and former political prisoner Abdullah Qatanani, from the Housing Projects area, in addition to Mohammad Hisham Sa'ad and Radwan Al-Qatanani, from the Askar refugee camp. (IMEMC 23 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers shot a young Palestinian man in the chest and caused dozens to suffer the effects of tear gas inhalation in Deir Dibwan town, east of Ramallah, in the central part of the occupied West Bank. Dozens of illegal paramilitary Israeli colonizers attempted to infiltrate the village and burnt

objects at the town's main entrance before the locals intercepted them and forced them to retreat. Israeli soldiers invaded the area and started firing live rounds, rubber-coated steel bullets, and gas bombs at the Palestinians. (IMEMC 23 June 2023)

- A Palestinian who Israeli soldiers shot and seriously injured Friday when the army invaded Nablus, in the northern part of the occupied West Bank died. Tareq Mohammad Khalil Idrees, 39, from Askar refugee camp in Nablus, was shot with live rounds in the abdomen and remained critical until he succumbed to his wounds. Tareq was rushed to the Specialized Arab Hospital in Nablus due to gunshot wounds to the abdomen and underwent surgery but remained in a serious condition until he succumbed to his wounds. The Palestinian was seriously injured when dozens of soldiers invaded Nablus on Friday dawn, leading to massive protests and exchanges of fire with Palestinian resistance fighters. (IMEMC 24 June 2023)
- Palestinian surgeons had to remove the eye of a Palestinian child, five years of age, after Israeli soldiers shot him with a rubber-coated steel bullet in his father's car, near Nablus, in the northern part of the occupied West Bank. The child, Khaled Akram Malalha, 5, was injured Friday when the soldiers fired rubber-coated steel bullets at his father's car while driving near Bazaria village, northwest of Nablus. The child was immediately rushed to the Najah Hospital, where the doctors performed scans and tried to save his eye, but the bullet caused extensive damage to the eye and the nerves. (IMEMC 24 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers fatally shot a Palestinian after he reportedly opened fire at soldiers and security guards at the Qalandia Terminal, north of occupied Jerusalem in the West Bank, wounding a guard and another person. According to Israeli reports, the Palestinian arrived at the terminal and opened fire, mildly wounding a guard and another Israeli, before the soldiers shot and killed him. The Palestinian has been identified as Ishaq Hamdi Amin Al-Ajlouni, 18, from Kafer Aqeb town, north of occupied Jerusalem. After killing the young man, the Israeli Internal Security summoned Ishaq's mother and his sister for interrogation at the Al-Maskobiyya interrogation facility and detention center. Following the incident, soldiers and police officers were deployed in and around the terminal and closed it to the Palestinians (IMEMC 24 June 2023)

- During their invasion to the Bethlehem area, the soldiers shot tear gas at Palestinians protesting their invasion, causing dozens of Palestinians to suffer from the effects of tear gas inhalation. The protests took place in the “al-Matina area” at the eastern entrance to the village of Husan, west of the Bethlehem governorate, during which the soldiers fired bullets, tear gas canisters, and sound grenades. In a related context, the Israeli occupation forces caused a power outage in the village of Husan. the Israeli occupation forces deliberately fired at the transformer that supplies the village with electric current, which led to its breakdown and power outage in the entire village. (IMEMC 25 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers invaded and ransacked many homes of political prisoners and ex-detainees in occupied Jerusalem, in the West Bank, and confiscated cash and cars. The soldiers ransacked many homes of political prisoners and former detainees, causing excessive damage, and interrogated many Palestinians. The soldiers invaded the home of former political prisoner Yacoub Abu Assab and confiscated a car for his family and other property in their home, for receiving a salary from the Palestinian Authority. (IMEMC 26 June 2023)
- Israeli forces uprooted dozens of olive trees in Khallet al-Qutun area, near Tuqu town, east of the occupied West Bank city of Bethlehem, according to a local activist. The occupation forces chopped down some 70 perennial olive trees planted in a three-donum grove, close to Khallet al-Qutun, belonging to Yousef Ibayyat. (Wafa 26 June 2023)
- Israeli occupation forces this morning raided the homes of several former Palestinian prisoners in occupied East Jerusalem and seized money and personal property, mainly cars, according to local sources. Israeli forces raided homes of former prisoners in several East Jerusalem neighborhoods, took whatever cash money they found, as well as jewelry, and seized vehicles, some belonging to their parents or wives, under the pretext that the former prisoners were receiving allowances and salaries from the Palestinian Authority. (Wafa 26 June 2023)
- The Israeli soldiers also invaded the home of former detainee Bassel Obeidat in Jabal Al-Mokabber town and ransacked the property before confiscating his father’s car in addition to a sum of cash, also for receiving a salary from the Palestinian Authority. (IMEMC 26 June 2023)

- In addition, the army invaded the home of former detainee Mohammad Kamal Obeid in Al-Isawiya town before confiscating a motorcycle and some gold and imposing a 40 thousand Shekels fine. Also in Al-Isawiya, the soldiers invaded the home of detainee Mohammad Bakr Mustafa, ransacked the property, stormed his home, confiscated his car, and invaded the home of detainee Mohammad Al-Abbassi before confiscating his father's car and some cash. It is worth mentioning that the soldiers also invaded and ransacked the homes of several former political prisoners, including Mousa Fatafta, Omar Obeid, Ala' Salah, Ezzeddin Barbar, his son Abdul-Rahim, Ghazi Kanaan, Mohammad Odah, Majd Karaki, Anas Abu Sneina, Ahmad Manasra, and Hasan Khalfawi. (IMEMC 26 June 2023)
- In Silwan town, the soldiers invaded the home of former political prisoner Mohammad Odah and searched it. In Jerusalem's Old City, the soldiers stormed and ransacked the home of former political prisoner, Hasan Khalfawi. In Beit Hanina, north of Jerusalem, the soldiers invaded the home of detainee Ahmad Manasra, before confiscating his father's car and some cash. On January 30, the General Committee at the Israeli Knesset approved in first reading various laws regarding stripping "residency rights" of any Palestinian detainee from occupied Jerusalem who receives or received a salary from the Palestinian Authority and was convicted of "endangering the security of the state." (IMEMC 26 June 2023)
- Dozens of Palestinian civilians suffered the effects of tear gas inhalation during clashes with the Israeli occupation forces in the village of Rummana, west of Jenin. In response to this and the ongoing violations of Palestinian rights, Palestinian resistance fighters fired two rockets from Jenin into Israel, marking the first time that rockets have been fired from the West Bank. No injuries or damage were reported from the rockets. The Israeli occupation forces stormed the village of Rummana which led to clashes, during which the forces fired tear gas and stun grenades. Dozens of civilians suffered the effects of the poisonous tear gas, and were treated at the scene. Later, the Israeli occupation forces seized a house under construction in the village of Rummana, and turned it into an observation point. The house belongs to Rami Abdel-Razzaq Abu Hammad. In addition, the Israeli occupation forces stormed the villages of Jalboun and Faqqu'a, northeast of Jenin, which led to clashes between young men and those forces. The occupation forces also intensified their military presence south and west of Jenin. This invasion comes a week after a massive

invasion of Jenin refugee camp, during which Israeli forces killed eight Palestinians and wounded 91. (IMEMC 27 June 2023)

- Israeli soldiers invaded the Bab Ar-Rahma Mosque in the Al-Aqsa Mosque compound and attacked many worshipers before abducting some of them. The soldiers surrounded the Bab Ar-Rahma Mosque before storming it and attacking many worshipers. The soldiers abducted several worshipers before taking them to a nearby police center. The soldiers also abducted a young man in one of the courtyards of Al-Aqsa Mosque before detaining and interrogating many others while trying to enter the holy site on the first day of the Al-Adha Muslim feast. Furthermore, the soldiers detained several young Palestinian men in Al-Wad Street, Mujahidin Street, and Bab Hutta before detaining and interrogating many Palestinians while inspecting their ID cards. (IMEMC 28 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers injured several Palestinians in Toura village, west of Jenin, in the occupied West Bank's northern part. Several army jeeps invaded the village, leading to protests before the soldiers fired rubber-coated steel bullets, gas bombs, and concussion grenades. Many Palestinians suffered the effects of tear gas inhalation and received the needed treatment from local medics. The soldiers also installed a roadblock on the street that links the village with surrounding villages and towns before the soldiers stopped and searched cars and interrogated many Palestinians while inspecting their ID cards. (IMEMC 29 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers invaded several villages and towns in the Jenin governorate, in the occupied West Bank's northern part. The soldiers invaded Jalboun, Faqqu'a, and Al-Jalama, northeast of Jenin, Ta'nak, Tayba, Rommana, and Toura, west of Jenin, and Siolet Ath-Thaher, south of the city. The army significantly increased its deployment around the villages, towns, and many streets in several parts of the governorate. Furthermore, the army installed many military roadblocks around the villages, towns, and Jenin City while military drones flew overhead. (IMEMC 29 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers assaulted and abducted a young Palestinian man while crossing a military roadblock near Ramallah in the occupied West Bank's central part. The soldiers installed a sudden military roadblock near Ein Siniya village, north of Ramallah, stopped and searched dozens of cars, and interrogated many Palestinians while inspecting their ID cards. The soldiers forced a young man, Wasim Ahmad Rimawi, 22, from Beit Rima town

northwest of Ramallah, out of a car and repeatedly assaulted him before abducting him. Also at dawn, the soldiers invaded Burin village, south of Nablus in the northern part of the occupied West Bank, and injured two Palestinians during ensuing protests. (IMEMC 30 June 2023)

- Israeli forces attacked Palestinian residents in the village of Qaryout to the south of Nablus for fending off an Israeli settlers' incursion into a water spring in the village. Eyewitnesses told Wafa that settlers stormed an area to the west of the village of Qaryout in an attempt to take over the spring. Residents rushed to the area to fend off the settlers' attempt to take over the spring but were attacked by Israeli forces, who provided protection to settlers. Forces attacked residents with tear gas canisters, causing several people to suffocate. This isn't the first such attempt by settlers to take over the spring. (Wafa 30 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers invaded Burin village, south of Nablus in the northern part of the occupied West Bank, and injured two Palestinians during ensuing protests. Several army vehicles invaded the village before the soldiers fired many rubber-coated steel bullets, gas bombs, and concussion grenades. One Palestinian suffered the effects of tear gas inhalation, and another resident sustained cuts and bruises when he fell as the soldiers chased them. In related news, the soldiers invaded Burqa and Sebastia village, west of Nablus, and Kafr Qallil, south of the city, leading to protests. (IMEMC 30 June 2023)



Israeli Settler Violence



- Israeli settlers set large swathes of land on fire and destroyed tombstones in two separate incidents in the northern occupied West Bank province of Nablus, according to local sources. Fo'ad Hasan, a local Palestinian activist, told Wafa that a group of Israeli settlers from the illegal settlement of Yesh Kodish set large swathes of land on fire on the outskirts of the town of Qusra, south of Nablus, in yet a new attack on local residents' properties. Meantime, Israeli settlers destroyed a number of tombstones after storming a graveyard in the town of Burqa, northwest of Nablus. (Wafa 1 June 2023)
- Israeli settlers chopped down scores of trees and erected tents in Beit Ummar town, north of the occupied West Bank city of Hebron, according to a local activist. A group of settlers, under army protection, barged their way into the agricultural land in 'Ein al-Beida area, which constitutes part

- of the southern West Bank village, and cut 25 olive trees and grapevines, all belonging to Ahmad 'Adi, a local farmer. The settlers set up tents around the local water spring there on a plot of land belonging to Mohammad 'Adi, another farmer. The farmers pointed that the settlers have been constantly sabotaging the crops and intruding upon groves of Palestinian farmers in the area as a means to advance their plan to seize the water spring and expand the nearby colonial settlement of Bat Ayin. (Wafa 1 June 2023)
- Israeli settlers fenced off tracts of Palestinian land in the northern Jordan Valley, according to a local activist. A group of over 10 settlers erected a fence around tracts of Palestinian land, north of Um al-'Ubar area and to the west of Road 90, which extends the length of the valley parallel to the Jordan River, citing the designation of the land as a nature reserve as a pretext. Designating an area as a nature reserve may convey the impression that Israel wishes to protect the environment. In practice, however, Israel has been using such designations for advancing the ethnic cleansing of Palestinians. (Wafa 1 June 2023)
 - Israeli colonizers attacked homes and punctured a vehicle's tires, and hurled Molotov cocktails at a car and workers rehabilitating a road near Nablus in the northern part of the occupied West Bank. The colonizers attacked several homes in Burqa town, northwest of Nablus. The colonizers hurled stones at a Palestinian home and tried to break into the property before the locals intercepted their assault and forced them to leave. Daghlis also stated that the colonizers punctured a vehicle's tires while working on rehabilitating a street in Madama village, south of Nablus. In addition, the colonizers hurled Molotov cocktails at a Palestinian car and punctured another vehicle's tires. (IMEMC 1 June 2023)
 - Illegal Israeli colonizers brought their sheep to graze on Palestinian lands in the Samra area in Masafer Yatta, causing damage to hundreds of trees. (IMEMC 2 June 2023)
 - Israeli settlers hurled stones at Palestinian vehicles on the road connecting the towns of Turmus Ayya and Al-Mughayir, to the northeast of Ramallah in the occupied West Bank, according to Palestinian security sources. They told Wafa that a group of Israeli settlers attacked vehicles with stones as they drove through the road. No injuries or damage were reported. (Wafa 3 June 2023)

- Led by Israeli rabbi and MP Yehuda Glick, scores of Israeli settlers guarded by police broke into the Al-Aqsa Mosque compound in occupied Jerusalem, according to local sources. Witnesses told WAFA that scores of Israeli settlers led by Glick entered the compound in groups and performed rituals there under the protection of Israeli police officers. (WAFA 4 June 2023)
- Israeli settlers set up tents on Palestinian-owned lands outside the town of Deir Ballut in the occupied West Bank province of Salfit, according to local sources. Samir Nemr, the mayor of the town, told WAFA that dozens of Israeli settlers set up tents and raised Israeli flags and banners bearing racist slogans on lands belonging to Palestinians from the neighboring village of Al-Lubban Al-Gharbi. Nemr expressed his fear that the latest move could be a prelude for the establishment of a new Israeli settlement outpost in the area. (MEMC 4 June 2023)
- Israeli settlers Sunday attacked Palestinian-owned houses in the village of Burqa, northwest of the occupied West Bank city of Nablus. A group of settlers sneaked from the illegal formerly evicted settlement of Homesh under protection from Israeli forces and attacked citizens' houses in several areas in the village. Confrontations broke out after villagers fought off the settlers. One Palestinian was injured after he was hit with a gas canister in his hand, while dozens of others suffered from suffocation due to inhaling toxic gas. Daghlas noted that about 50 settlers stoned a house located on the outskirts of the village and broke the windshield of three vehicles. (WAFA 4 June 2023)
- Israeli settlers broke into Islamic sites in the town of Kifl Haris, north of the occupied West Bank city of Salfit. Osama Saleh, head of the Kifl Haris municipality, told WAFA that Israeli settlers performed Talmudic rituals in the area. Israeli forces intensified their military measures during the raid and prevented Palestinians from using bypass roads inside the village. (WAFA 5 June 2023)
- Israeli settlers assaulted a number of Palestinians and torched a vehicle near Kafr Thulth town, south of the occupied West Bank city of Qalqiliya, according to local sources. A group of Jewish supremacist settlers, under army protection, attacked Palestinians in the eastern part of the town, pelting them with rocks and beating them with sticks, and set a vehicle on fire. Instead of acting to prevent the settler attack, Israeli occupation forces violently suppressed Palestinians defending the village, hitting one by a rubber-coated steel bullet, while pointing that a number of others sustained bruises and cuts due to the attack. The assailants came from El Matan, a

- colonial settlement outpost established on the lands of the nearby Palestinian village of Wad Qana. Meanwhile, another group of settlers attacked Palestinians in Ain Samiya area, east of Ramallah, uprooting trees and destroying irrigation networks. The assailants also hurled stones toward Palestinian registered vehicles, resulting in damage. (Wafa 5 June 2023)
- A group of illegal paramilitary Israeli colonizers attacked Palestinians, damaged rooms, and cut trees in the Ein Samia area near Kafr Malek village, northeast of Ramallah, in the occupied West Bank's central part. The colonizers invaded the community, attacked several Palestinians, and hurled stones at cars, causing damage. The colonizers also cut several trees, caused damage to a few agricultural rooms, and assaulted Palestinians from the Wall & Colonization Resistance Commission while distributing food packages to families in the Al-Qaboun area near Ein Samia. (IMEMC 6 June 2023)
 - Settlers from the illegal Karmiel settlement, which is built on the lands of the town of Yatta, south of Hebron, set up tents and seized a water well in Masafer Yatta, according to Osama Makhamra, an anti-settlement activist, as they chased herders out of the pastures. A number of settlers set up tents in al-Thala area, seized a water well, and prevented shepherds and others from accessing it, while they grazed their sheep in agricultural lands and destroyed their summer crops. Meanwhile, settlers of Ein al-Bayda settlement expanded their so-called farm at the expense of the local residents and continue to prevent farmers from accessing it, while chasing herders out of the land in preparation to control the pastures. (Wafa 6 June 2023)
 - Dozens of fanatic Israeli settlers Wednesday morning broke into the compounds of al-Aqsa Mosque under heavy protection from the Israeli police, Islamic Waqf confirmed. Israeli settlers, divided into groups, raided the holy Islamic Mosque from al-Maghariba gate and took provocative tours in its compounds. Israeli settlers performed Talmudic rituals in the eastern part of the Mosque. This comes at a time as Israeli forces intensify measures against Palestinians coming from Jerusalem to enter the Mosque, inspecting their IDs and briefly detaining them. (Wafa 7 June 2023)
 - Israeli settlers stole 14 sheep owned by a local resident in the town of Kufr al-Dik, to the west of Salfit, according to the town's mayor Mohammed Naji. He told Wafa that settlers from the settlement of Badawil, built illegally

- on Kufr al-Dik lands, stole 14 sheep belonging to Adnan al-Dik. (WAFA 7 June 2023)
- Israeli settlers attacked Palestinian houses in al-Mazra'a al-Gharbiya village, northwest of the occupied West Bank city of Ramallah, according to local sources. Scores of Israeli settlers, under army protection, closed the road leading to the village and descended upon it before attacking a house and the villagers who attempted to protect their village. The assailants deliberately wreaked destruction in their way, igniting fires, vandalizing a number of nearby agricultural rooms and uprooting dozens of trees in the area. Instead of any action to stop the attack, Israeli occupation soldiers cracked down on the villagers, showering them with volleys of tear gas canisters and causing dozens to suffocate. (WAFA 8 June 2023)
 - Israeli settlers attacked Palestinian civilians in the neighborhoods of Wadi Hasin and Jaber in the Old City of Hebron, south of the occupied West Bank, causing minor injuries among local residents. Army-guarded Israeli settlers hurled stones and let their dogs attack Palestinians after raiding the two neighborhoods, causing some of the local Palestinian residents to lose consciousness. Meantime, a group of Israeli settlers physically assaulted a Palestinian shepherd while grazing his sheep in Masafer Yatta area, south of Hebron, causing him bruises. (WAFA 10 June 2023)
 - Israeli colonizers attacked many Palestinians in Hebron City and Masfaer Yatta, in the southern part of the occupied West Bank. The colonizers invaded the neighborhoods in Wad Al-Haseen, Jaber Neighborhood, and the Shuhadaq Steet, in the center of Hebron, hurled stones, pepper-sprayed many Palestinians, and unleashed their dogs on them. Several Palestinians were injured, including some who fainted due to the attacks. The soldiers also attacked Mohamad Ahmad Shawahin while grazing his sheep in the Al-Adra area in Masafer Yatta, south of Hebron, causing contusions and bruises. (IMEMC 10 June 2023)
 - Colonial Israeli settlers stole 10 sheep last night belonging to Palestinians in the village of Yasuf, in the occupied West Bank province of Salfit. A group of Israeli settlers from the nearby colonial settlement of Tappuah stole 10 sheep belonging to Tha'er Naeem Ebeid, a local Palestinian resident. Thefts and acts of vandalism by Israeli settlers are commonplace across the occupied West Bank, and are rarely prosecuted by Israeli occupation authorities. (WAFA 10 June 2023)
 - Scores of Israeli settlers guarded by Israeli police stormed the courtyards of the Al-Aqsa Mosque compound in occupied Jerusalem this morning, according to witnesses. Scores of Israeli settlers entered the compound

- through the Moroccan Gate in groups and performed rituals there under the protection of Israeli police officers. (Wafa 11 June 2023)
- Scores of Israeli settlers guarded by Israeli police stormed the courtyards of the Al-Aqsa Mosque compound in occupied Jerusalem this morning, according to witnesses. Scores of Israeli settlers entered the compound through the Moroccan Gate in groups and performed rituals there under the protection of Israeli police officers. (Wafa 11 June 2023)
 - Israeli settlers grazed their sheep on Palestinian groves in Masafer Yatta area, south of Hebron, causing significant destruction to planted crops, according to a local official. A group of settlers grazed their livestock on a land planted with crops, belonging to local Palestinian residents. Local Palestinians were denied access into their own lands by the Israeli occupation army during the presence of the settlers. (Wafa 11 June 2023)
 - Many Israeli colonizers brought their livestock to graze on Palestinian farmlands in the Ath-Tha'la area in Masafer Yatta, south of Hebron, in the southern part of the occupied West Bank. Dozens of colonizers invaded large areas of Palestinian farmlands and brought their livestock to graze on them. The farmers planted their lands with summer produce that they use and sell as a main, and in many cases, the only source of income. Israeli soldiers were present when the colonizers invaded the farmlands in the areas of Zweidin, Fateh Sadra, Al-Ein Al-Baida, Hilal Al-Adra, Samra, Al-Qweiwis, Maghayir Al-Abeed, and all areas near the illegal colonies of Karmiel, Ma'on, Avigal, Hever and Mitzpe Yair, built on stolen Palestinian lands in Masafer Yatta. (IMEMC 12 June 2023)
 - Israeli settlers attacked Palestinian commuters driving on northern West Bank roads causing damage to some vehicles. Israeli settlers threw rocks at Palestinian vehicles traveling on the road between the towns of Jaloud and Qusra, south of Nablus, breaking windows of some cars and causing panic among the commuters, who included elderly people, women and children. The settlers also went on a rampage on the road while the soldiers, who are usually present in large numbers, did not intervene to stop them or arrest anyone. (Wafa 12 June 2023)
 - Israeli settlers set fire to agricultural fields owned by Palestinians in the town of 'Asira al-Qibliya to the south of Nablus. Israeli settlers from the Israeli settlement of Yetsahar, built illegally on Palestinian-owned land, set fire to privately-owned agricultural land located at the eastern part of the town. The land is located adjacent to the settlement of Yetsahar and residents face difficulty reaching it. (Wafa 12 June 2023)

- Israeli colonizers attacked many Palestinian cars, causing damage, on the road between Qusra and Jaloud and burnt lands in Asira Al-Qibliyya, south of the northern West Bank city of Nablus. The colonizers gathered large numbers and hurled stones at the Palestinian cars. Several cars sustained damage, especially to the windshields, while the colonizers partially closed the road. (IMEMC 13 June 2023)
- Israeli colonizers attacked Palestinian shepherds in the Al-Bweib area, east of Yatta town, south of Hebron, in the southern part of the occupied West Bank. The colonizers came from the illegal Bnei Hever colony, built on stolen Palestinian lands, east of Yatta. The colonizers brought their sheep to graze on Palestinian lands in the Ein Ash-Shannara area near Al-Bweib, and assaulted several Palestinian shepherds while threatening to shoot them if they did not leave the area. The colonizers assaulted Palestinian shepherds in the Ath-Tha'la area in Masafer Yatta earlier Thursday. (IMEMC 15 June 2023)
- Illegal Israeli settlers stormed the Al-Aqsa Mosque in occupied East Jerusalem while occupation police provided security, according to local sources. According to the Wadi Hilweh Information Center, at least 108 settlers entered the Muslim holy site in the morning, while 53 were documented entering the compound in the afternoon. Under the protection of Israeli police forces, the illegal colonists were granted access to the site through the Mughrabi Gate and proceeded to tour the site and perform Talmudic rituals. Meanwhile, it was added that Israeli Intelligence officers removed the security guard assigned by the Islamic Endowments Department and stormed the Bab al-Rahma chapel. (IMEMC 15 June 2023)
- Israeli settlers attacked Palestinian shepherds while herding in the open pastures in al-Thaala area in Masafer Yatta, in the South Hebron Hills, and forced them to leave the pastures, according to local activist Usama Makhamra. He told Wafa that armed settlers from the illegal settlement of Karmiel attacked the shepherds and assaulted them, and threatened to shoot them if they do not leave the area and never to come back to it. At the same time, the settlers, who set up their own livestock farms in the area in order to take over the lands by creating new facts on the ground, let their sheep loose to roam the fields planted by the Palestinians with various kinds of agricultural products in a deliberate attempt to cause as much damage as possible to the crops. Settlers, under army protection, also

- attacked shepherds in al-Boeib area of Masafer Yatta and forced them to leave it as the settlers' sheep grazed in the same area. (Wafa 15 June 2023)
- Armed Israeli settlers assaulted and opened fire on Palestinians in the Ein Samia village, east of the occupied West Bank city of Ramallah, according to local sources. As the villagers headed to their farmland in the village, they were shocked to find out that dozens of armed settlers, under army protection, barged their way into the area. The settlers opened live ammunition and fired barrages of bombs towards the villagers, but there was not any injury. (Wafa 16 June 2023)
 - Israeli colonizers burnt Palestinian lands in Husan village, west of Bethlehem, in the occupied West Bank. The colonizers invaded the Qiddis area, surrounded and isolated by the illegal Bitar Illit colony, and burned dozens of olive trees. The two young Palestinian men suffocated while trying to extinguish the fire before the medics rushed them to a hospital in Bethlehem. The colonizers also tried to prevent the Palestinians from extinguishing the fire and assaulted some of them. Notably, the colonizers have recently escalated their violations against the Palestinians and their lands in Husan, including burning and bulldozing lands and uprooting trees. In related news, Israeli soldiers bulldozed farmlands and side roads near the Dotan military base, especially close to the main street between Jenin and Tulkarem in the northern West Bank. (IMEMC 17 June 2023)
 - Colonial Israeli settlers stole 10 sheep last night belonging to Palestinians in the village of Yasuf, in the occupied West Bank province of Salfit, according to local sources. Saleh Yasin, mayor of the village, told Wafa that a group of Israeli settlers from the nearby colonial settlement of Tappuah stole 10 sheep belonging to Tha'er Naeem Ebeid, a local Palestinian resident. Thefts and acts of vandalism by Israeli settlers are commonplace across the occupied West Bank, and are rarely prosecuted by Israeli occupation authorities. (Wafa 18 June 2023)
 - Groups of Israeli settlers guarded by Israeli police broke into the courtyards of the Al-Aqsa Mosque compound in occupied Jerusalem this morning, according to witnesses. Scores of Israeli settlers entered the compound through the Moroccan Gate in groups and performed rituals there under the protection of Israeli police officers. During the presence of the Israeli settlers inside the holy site, Israeli police imposed restrictions on the entry of Palestinian Muslims into the holy site, including bodily searching some of them and retaining their identity cards. (Wafa 18 June 2023)

- Israeli colonizers cut dozens of olive saplings in Um Safa village, northwest of Ramallah, in the central part of the occupied West Bank. The colonizers infiltrated Palestinian orchards and cut more than 20 olive saplings. The colonizers also caused property damage and stole a water tank from one of the invaded Palestinian lands. The locals managed to chase the colonizers out of their lands before the Israeli assailants fled to the illegal Ateret colony, built on lands stolen from the Palestinians in Um Safa and Atara village. (IMEMC 19 June 2023)
- Israeli settlers this evening attacked Palestinian residents' homes and vehicles in the village of Burin to the south of Nablus, in the northern occupied West Bank. Palestinian residents managed to fend off the attack against their homes located on the outskirts of the said village. The settlers further attacked Palestinian-registered vehicles driving on the road connecting Huwwara and Qalqilia. (Wafa 20 June 2023)
- Hundreds of Israeli settlers, protected by soldiers, went on a rampage in the occupied West Bank, attacking Palestinian vehicles and villages and causing damage and injuring people. The armed settlers threw rocks at Palestinian vehicles on West Bank streets, breaking windows of several cars and injuring passengers while soldiers looked from a distance and intervened only to protect the settlers if they face any resistance from the Palestinians who were trying to defend themselves and protect their families from the brutal settlers. Fields were also set on fire in different villages and towns north of Ramallah causing serious damage to crops and trees. The rampage, arson and pogrom came following the killing of four Israeli settlers in a shooting attack at a settlement north of Ramallah. (Wafa 21 June 2023)
- Hundreds of Israeli settlers, protected by soldiers, went on a rampage in the occupied West Bank, attacking Palestinian vehicles and villages and causing damage and injuring people. The armed settlers threw rocks at Palestinian vehicles on West Bank streets, breaking windows of several cars and injuring passengers while soldiers looked from a distance and intervened only to protect the settlers if they face any resistance from the Palestinians who were trying to defend themselves and protect their families from the brutal settlers. Fields were also set on fire in different villages and towns north of Ramallah causing serious damage to crops and trees. The rampage, arson and pogrom came following the killing of four Israeli settlers in a shooting attack at a settlement north of Ramallah. (Wafa 21 June 2023)

- Israeli colonizers destroyed three agricultural rooms and damaged tools and equipment inside them, in addition to uprooting trees, in Burqa village, northwest of Nablus in the occupied West Bank's northern part. The colonizers invaded lands in the Al-Mas'udiyya area in Burqa before destroying an agricultural room owned by Hani Makhalfa and damaging its furniture and tools. Hani stated that the colonizers uprooted 25 olive and fig trees near the agricultural room they destroyed on his land. The colonizers also destroyed two agricultural rooms owned by other Palestinians near Hani's property and broke their windows, doors, and agricultural supplies and tools. (MEMC 21 June 2023)
- A settler forced at gunpoint shepherds in the village of Kisan, east of Bethlehem, to leave the pastures and prevented them from grazing their sheep, according to the head of the Kisan village council, Musa Abiyat. He told WAFA that a settler was grazing his sheep on private land planted with olive trees not more than 100 meters from homes in the village and adjacent to the illegal settlement of Ibi Hanahel, built on village lands. Settlers, under army protection, regularly attack the shepherds in Kisan and prevent them from grazing their sheep, while assaulting them and their sheep, shooting them, holding them and their sheep, and imposing fines against them, in addition to physically assaulting them causing injury, bruises and wounds to some. (WAFA 21 June 2023)
- Israeli settlers continued their pogrom in the occupied Palestinian territories, setting fire to Palestinian vehicles, shops and fields. Israeli settlers attacked al-Lubban al-Gharbieh village, northwest of Ramallah, vandalizing shops and vehicles and causing heavy damage to property. Last night, settlers rampaged through most of the areas north of Ramallah, setting fire to fields and vehicles and throwing rocks at cars with Palestinian license plates driving on the roads. Israeli settlers rampaged in several villages north of Ramallah, set fire to a Red Crescent ambulance and large areas of farmland, a junkyard and a car wash, along with several vehicles and a room in a gas station in al-Lubban al-Sharqiya village. Palestinian firefighters were able to extinguish the fire in the gas station before reaching the fuel tanks, which would have caused a big disaster in the village. The firefighters also extinguished fire set by the settlers to the yards of Palestinian houses and cars in the village. A total of 140 cars were damaged or set on fire in the settlers' pogrom. The Israeli occupation forces joined the settlers in their attacks at the Palestinian civilians in these villages, shooting rubber-coated metal bullets and tear gas canisters at those who came out to

defend themselves and their families causing at least 34 injuries. The pogroms came after four settlers were shot dead in an attack at the entrance to an illegal Jewish settlement near al-Lubban village. The two alleged Palestinian attackers were later killed by the Israeli occupation forces. (Wafa 21 June 2023)

- Israeli settlers attacked, the homes of Palestinians in the town of Kufr al-Dik, west of the northern West Bank city of Salfit, and closed the roads to passers-by, according to the town's mayor Mohammad Naji. He told Wafa that a number of settlers attacked the homes located on the outskirts of the town, and broke the windows of several houses. It is worth mentioning that the settlers, under the protection of the Israeli occupation forces, closed yesterday all the entrances to the villages and towns of the Salfit Governorate, and attacked vehicles and homes. (Wafa 21 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers and paramilitary colonizers injured at least thirty-four Palestinians, damaged 140 cars and burnt a Palestinian ambulance, a car, and a room in a gas station in several areas extending from Tormos Ayya, east of the central West Bank city of Ramallah, to Deir Sharaf, east of the northern West Bank city of Nablus. The colonizers and the soldiers invaded many areas between Ramallah and Nablus, attacked buildings and cars, leading to protests before they shot 34 Palestinians with live fire and rubber-coated steel bullets. The colonizers attacked and caused damage to 140 Palestinian cars, in addition to burning an ambulance and a car in Huwwara town, south of Nablus. The colonizers invaded the villages and towns of Turmus Ayya, Beit Furik, Awarta, Huwwara, Al-Lubban Ash-Sharqiya, Za'tara, Yasuf, and Deir Sharaf, and burnt agricultural lands. Also, Palestinian firefighters extinguished fires in two Palestinian cars and a guard room in a gas station, a car salvage facility, and a carwash facility at the entrance of the Al-Lubban Ash-Sharqiya, south of Nablus. The firefighters extinguished the fire in the gas station before it spread to the fuel pumps, avoiding a potentially serious disaster in the facility and surrounding areas. In addition, the colonizers caused damage to the windows of many homes, cars, and shops in Beitin village, east of Ramallah, and caused damage to many cars in a car dealership in Beitin village, east of Ramallah, in the central West Bank. They also hurled stones and caused damage to at least one car and fired many live rounds on a bypass road near Deir Dibwan town before Israeli soldiers fired many gas bombs and concussion grenades at the Palestinians who intercepted the attacks and the surrounding homes. It is worth mentioning that the colonizers also hurled

stones at cars on the Al-Mo'arrajat street, linking Jericho with Ramallah, causing damage. (IMEMC 21 June 2023)

- Continuing their rampage of terror and violence against the Palestinian people, Israeli settlers Wednesday afternoon torched a large tract of farmland in Husan village, west of the occupied West Bank city of Bethlehem, according to WAFA correspondent. Jewish settlers set fire to a large tract of farmland belonging to the villagers of Husan for the second time within few days, destroying dozens of olive trees and triggering confrontations. The villagers gathered to put off the fire, but they found it difficult to reach the area. The arsonists came from the nearby encroaching colonial settlement of Beitar Illit. The gun-toting soldiers unleashed barrages of fire on the young men, particularly at the eastern entrance to the village, the epicenter of confrontations, without any report of casualties. Meanwhile, settlers attacked once again Burqa town, northwest of the West Bank city of Nablus, descending upon a house at the town entrance and attempting to attack it, triggering confrontations. The attacks came just few hours after settlers sabotaged three agricultural shacks, ruined their contents and destroyed trees in the town. Meanwhile, Israeli settlers congregated at the entrance of Yasuf village, east of Salfit, and hurled stones at Palestinian vehicles travelling nearby, smashing their windshields, and attempted to verbally assault the passengers. (WAFA 21 June 2023)
- Israeli settlers proceeded to build new housing units in the illegal Israeli settlement of Givat Salit, in the northern Jordan Valley. Israeli settlers proceeded to build around 55 new housing units in the said settlement. (WAFA 21 June 2023)
- Israeli settlers sabotaged three agricultural shacks and ruined their contents, and destroyed trees in the village of Burqa, northwest of the northern West Bank city of Nablus. Hani Makhalfeh, a landowner, said he was surprised when he arrived at his land this morning of the heavy damage caused by the settlers to his agricultural shack and all its contents, and the cutting of 25 lemon and fig trees planted in his land. The settlers also sabotaged two other agricultural shacks that belong to his neighbors and broke their windows. (WAFA 21 June 2023)
- Hundreds of Israeli settlers, many of them armed, attacked the peaceful Palestinian town of Turmus Ayya, northeast of Ramallah, setting homes and vehicles of Palestinians on fire. The settlers, protected by Israeli soldiers, used brutal force against the unarmed town's residents, attacking people, their homes and vehicles while soldiers provided protection to the settlers and jointed in the attack on the town by firing tear gas canisters at

- the homes causing dozens of suffocation cases. Calls were made by the residents to save them as many were trapped inside their homes. It is estimated that over 50 vehicles and 30 homes were set ablaze as the armed settlers went on a pogrom from one street to another, taking their time in setting fire to the cars and homes. Any resistance from the residents was faced with army gunfire and a barrage of gas canisters. (Wafa 21 June 2023)
- Israeli settlers attacked a number of Palestinian-owned vehicles near the village of Al-Jaba'a, to the southwest of Bethlehem in the occupied West Bank, according to local sources. Diab Masha'leh, the mayor of the village, told Wafa that groups of hardcore Israeli settlers rampaged through the road connecting Al-Jaba'a with the nearby village of Nahalin, where they attacked Palestinian vehicles driving through the road. No injuries were reported. (Wafa 22 June 2023)
 - Israeli colonizers burnt Palestinian lands in the Qiddis area in Husan town, west of Bethlehem in the occupied West Bank. The colonizers invaded the lands before setting them ablaze, while the Palestinians faced numerous difficulties reaching their lands because there are isolated in the middle of the illegal Bitar Illit colony. A few days earlier, the colonizers burnt lands in the same area, torching dozens of olive trees and causing two Palestinians to suffocate from smoke inhalation. The lands are subject to repeated Israeli violations, including cutting and burning trees and assaults on the locals. In related news, Israeli soldiers invaded the Al-Matina area at the eastern entrance of Husan near its main street, leading to protests before the soldiers fired live rounds, rubber-coated steel bullets, and gas bombs. (IMEMC 22 June 2023)
 - Army-backed Israeli settlers attacked Jalud village, south of the occupied West Bank city of Nablus, according to local sources. Scores of Jewish supremacist settlers, under army protection, descended upon the outskirts of village and attacked a number of civilian houses, hurling stones towards them as the villagers attempted to confront them and defend their property. The gun-toting soldiers unleashed barrages of fire towards the villagers, injuring one by rubber-coated steel bullets in the head and two others by bullet shrapnel. Three other villagers sustained injuries in the stone-pelting at the hands of the settlers and dozens others suffered excessive tear gas suffocation. Local mosques' loudspeakers called residents from neighboring villages to help confront the pogrom-like attack. (Wafa 22 June 2023)

- Army-backed Israeli settlers attacked Jalud village, south of the occupied West Bank city of Nablus, according to local sources. Scores of Jewish supremacist settlers, under army protection, descended upon the outskirts of village and attacked a number of civilian houses, hurling stones towards them as the villagers attempted to confront them and defend their property. The gun-toting soldiers unleashed barrages of fire towards the villagers, injuring one by rubber-coated steel bullets in the head and two others by bullet shrapnel. Three other villagers sustained injuries in the stone-pelting at the hands of the settlers and dozens others suffered excessive tear gas suffocation. (Wafa 22 June 2023)
- Israeli settlers carried out a series of attacks tonight against Palestinians and their properties in the occupied West Bank province of Ramallah, according to local sources. In the town of Sinjil, scores of army-backed settlers attacked homes with stones in the neighborhood of Muzaira, provoking confrontations with local residents who bravely resisted the assault and forced the settlers out of the town. Fanatic Israeli settlers, backed by army, also attacked the village of Um Safa, north of Ramallah, but were thwarted by local Palestinian residents who gathered in large numbers to confront any attack on the village by Israeli settlers. Rampaging Israeli settlers also hurled stones at Palestinian vehicles driving through Ein Ayyub junction near the village of Ras Karkar. (Wafa 22 June 2023)
- Illegal Israeli settlers erected a new outpost on Palestinian-owned lands near the village of Mekhmas, to the northeast of occupied Jerusalem. A number of Israeli settlers broke into Al-Baqaa area, east of the village, and set up caravans in a prelude for a new colonial outpost there. The new Israeli outpost comes in the context of the far-right Israeli government's efforts to change the demographic balance in the occupied territories in favor of the Israeli settler population. Earlier in the day, Israeli settlers in support by the occupation forces set up six mobile homes on private Palestinian lands in the village of al-Lubban al-Sharqiya, on the road connecting Ramallah and Nablus in the north of the occupied West Bank. (Wafa 22 June 2023)
- Army-backed Israeli settlers attacked Jalud village, south of the occupied West Bank city of Nablus. Scores of Jewish supremacist settlers, under army protection, descended upon the outskirts of village and attacked a number of civilian houses, hurling stones towards them as the villagers attempted to confront them and defend their property. The gun-toting soldiers unleashed barrages of fire towards the villagers, injuring one by rubber-coated steel bullets in the head and two others by bullet shrapnel. Three

other villagers sustained injuries in the stone-pelting at the hands of the settlers and dozens others suffered excessive tear gas suffocation. Local mosques' loudspeakers called residents from neighboring villages to help confront the pogrom-like attack. (Wafa 22 June 2023)

- The Palestinian Health Ministry confirmed the death of a young Palestinian man whom Israeli colonizers killed after they invaded Turmus Ayya town, northeast of the central West Bank city of Ramallah, and burnt dozens of homes and cars. Omar Hisham Abdullah Jabara, 27, suffered a fatal gunshot wound to the chest after dozens of paramilitary colonizers invaded the town. More than 400 colonizers invaded the town and opened fire at dozens of homes and residents who intercepted the attack, wounding twelve with live fire. The colonizers burnt 30 Palestinian homes and more than 60 cars and said the Israeli assailants came from nearby illegal colonies and colonialist outposts on stolen Palestinian lands. (IMEMC 22 June 2023)
- Israeli settlers hurled stones tonight at Palestinian vehicles at the entrance to the village of Yasuf, in the occupied West Bank province of Salfit, according to local sources. Groups of Israeli settlers blocked the main road leading to the village and pelted stones at Palestinian vehicles driving through the road, causing damage to some of them but no injuries. (Wafa 22 June 2023)
- Israeli colonizers injured five Palestinians in Silwan town, south of the Al-Aqsa Mosque in occupied Jerusalem, in the West Bank. Palestinian medics treated five Palestinians injured in the attack. Also, Israeli soldiers fired gas bombs and concussion grenades at the Palestinians who intercepted a group of illegal Israeli colonizers who attacked their homes and property. Dozens of soldiers invaded and closed streets and neighborhoods in Silwan, blocking Palestinian traffic and imposing severe restrictions on the local's freedom of movement, especially in the Be'er Ayyoub neighborhood. (IMEMC 22 June 2023)
- Israeli colonizers attacked Palestinian homes in Hebron and Nablus, in the southern and the northern parts of the occupied West Bank. The colonizers gathered in the Al-Fahs area, south of Hebron city, and hurled stones at Palestinian cars. The attack did not cause injuries but resulted in damage to several Palestinian cars. In Ramallah, in the central West Bank, the colonizers gathered near the western entrance of Beitin village, northeast of the city, and hurled stones at Palestinian cars, causing damage. (IMEMC 22 June 2023)

- Five Palestinian civilians sustained injuries tonight in an attack by fanatic Israeli settlers in the occupied Jerusalem neighborhood of Silwan, according to medical sources. Five Palestinians received medical treatment after being beaten up and teargassed by police-guarded Israeli settlers in yet a new attack by Israeli settlers in the neighborhood. (Wafa 22 June 2023)
- A number of Palestinians suffered injuries tonight in yet a new price tag attack by Israeli settlers in Masafer Yatta area, to the south of Hebron, according to local sources. A group of army-guarded Israeli settlers from the illegal Israeli settlement of Maon assaulted Palestinian shepherds and civilians in the village of Khirbet Tuba, in Masafer Yatta region, causing bruises to some of them. The Israeli attack also resulted in moderate damage to a house in the village. A local Palestinian resident, identified as Jabr Ibrahim Awad, was arrested by Israeli occupation soldiers in the aftermath of the settlers' attack in the village. (Wafa 22 June 2023)
- Israeli settlers attacked a number of Palestinian-owned vehicles near the village of Al-Jaba'a, to the southwest of Bethlehem in the occupied West Bank, according to local sources. Diab Masha'leh, the mayor of the village, told Wafa that groups of hardcore Israeli settlers rampaged through the road connecting Al-Jaba'a with the nearby village of Nahalin, where they attacked Palestinian vehicles driving through the road. No injuries were reported. There has been a serious rise in violence by Israeli settlers against Palestinians across the occupied West Bank. Yesterday, scores of vehicles were set ablaze and dozens of homes attacked by army-guarded Israeli settlers in the town of Turmus Ayya, northeast of Ramallah. A Palestinian young man was also killed by Israeli occupation soldiers while confronting the settlers' attack on the town. (Wafa 22 June 2023)
- In the early hours of this morning, Israeli settlers in support by the occupation forces set up six mobile homes on private Palestinian lands in the village of al-Lubban al-Sharqiya, on the road connecting Ramallah and Nablus in the north of the occupied West Bank. Israeli army bulldozers leveled land in the area to prepare it for the establishment of the settlement outpost. The land is owned by Mousa al-Abd Aweis, Abdel-Rahim Noubani, and Ahmad Mahmoud Aweis. The construction of the new outpost is near where four Israeli settlers were shot and killed on Monday by Palestinian fighters. The Israeli government decided to build the new settlement outpost as a punitive measure against the Palestinians. (Wafa 22 June 2023)
- A Palestinian predawn sustained a gunfire injury and dozens others suffocated as Israeli settlers attempted to rampage through Deir Dibwan,

east of the occupied West Bank city of Ramallah, according to Wafa correspondent. The army-backed settlers tried to sneak their way into the town, setting fire at the entrance, but local youths, who were on alert, courageously confronted them, forcing them to retreat. Israeli troops fired volleys of fire towards the town youths, hitting one by a live round in the chest and causing dozens others to suffocate. Elsewhere in Ramallah district, a few dozen settlers, under army protection, congregated at the western entrance of Beitin village, close to al-Bireh city, and pelted Palestinian vehicles passing nearby with stones, causing damage to them. Meanwhile, another group of settlers hurled stones toward Palestinian-registered vehicles in al-Fahs area, south of Hebron city, smashing their windshields. (Wafa 23 June 2023)

- Israeli settler terrorism continued last night in the occupied West Bank with setting ablaze Palestinian fields in the town of Sair, northeast of the southern West Bank city of Hebron, destroying dozens of trees. Settlers from the illegal settlement of Asfar set fire to forest and other trees in Sair burning dozens of trees. (Wafa 24 June 2023)
- Israeli colonizers installed an outpost on stolen Palestinian lands in Deir Istiya town, west of Salfit, in the occupied West Bank's central part. The colonizers occupied, Palestinian lands in the Al-Qa'da area in the northern part of the town. The colonizers also installed two mobile homes and three barns on the stolen lands and started infrastructure work, including a street, electricity, and water. Israeli colonizers burnt dozens of Palestinian trees in the Wad Sa'ir area, northeast of Hebron, in the West Bank's southern part. (IMEMC 24 June 2023)
- Several homes were set on fire, an ambulance was partially damaged and a number of journalists survived a shooting attack by dozens of armed Israeli settlers who attacked the village of Umm Safa, to the north of Ramallah in the occupied West Bank, according to local sources. Marwan Sabbah, the mayor of the village, told Wafa that scores of army-backed fanatic Israeli settlers broke into the village and fired live shots indiscriminately at homes and properties in yet a new attack, resulting in the death of a private-owned horse and partially setting a number of houses on fire in the village. The shooting attack also caused damage to many vehicles, including an ambulance, and a paramedic was lightly injured by a gunshot while moving a patient in urgent condition to a hospital. Mohammad Radi, a Palestine TV cameraman, added that the settlers fired gunshots at him and his colleague, Falantina Abu Hamed, as they were covering the terrorist

attack by nearly 70 fanatic Israeli settlers on the village. One gunshot directly hit and damaged their camera. Radi said his colleague, Falantina, and he miraculously survived the shooting attack by the rampaging settlers. Meantime, another group of fanatic Israeli settlers physically assaulted a number of Palestinian civilians and destroyed six tents in the village of Al-Mughayir, to the northeast of Ramallah. Witnesses told WAFA that a number of settlers stormed Ein er-Rashrash neighborhood on the outskirts of the village, brutally assaulting nomadic Palestinian Bedouins camping there. The attack resulted in the injury of an 80-year-old Palestinian elderly, who was rushed to a nearby hospital in the aftermath of the attack. According to the sources, an Israeli army force stormed the neighborhood in the aftermath of the attack, and instead of arresting the attacking settlers, they arrested three Palestinian residents there. (WAFA 24 June 2023)

- An unidentified number of houses and vehicles were set on fire in a new pogrom carried out by state-backed Israeli settler militias in the village of Umm Safa, to the north of Ramallah in the occupied West Bank, according to local sources. Scores of Israeli settlers, some of them armed with rifles and guarded by army and Border Guards Police, stormed the village and fired indiscriminately at everything they came across, including homes and vehicles, setting several houses and cars on fire. The shooting attack also caused damage to an ambulance, and a paramedic was lightly injured by a gunshot while moving a patient in urgent condition to a hospital. Mohammad Radi, a Palestine TV cameraman, added that the settlers fired gunshots at him and his colleague, Falantina Abu Hamed, as they were covering the terrorist attack by nearly 70 fanatic Israeli settlers on the village. one gunshot directly hit and damaged their camera. Radi's colleague, Falantina, and he miraculously survived the shooting attack by the rampaging settlers. (WAFA 24 June 2023)
- Israeli settler militias attacked the Palestinian village of Urif, to the south of Nablus in the occupied West Bank, according to local sources. Abdelhakim Shehada, the village's mayor, told WAFA that scores of army-guarded Israeli settlers attacked the eastern neighborhood in the village, sparking confrontations with local residents. Earlier, several houses and vehicles were set on fire in a pogrom carried out by state-backed Israeli settler militias in the village of Umm Safa, to the north of Ramallah. (WAFA 24 June 2023)

- Heeding calls by their Israeli officials to build settlements in the occupied territories, settlers, protected by soldiers, established a new outpost on Palestinian lands in the town of Deir Istya, west of the northern West Bank city of Salit, according to the town's mayor Muath Salman. He told WAFA that dozens of settlers broke into an area north of the town, set up two mobile homes and three livestock sheds, opened a dirt road, and extended water and electricity lines to the site. Israel's far-right and fascist Minister of National Security, Itamar Ben Gvir, called on his followers to take over hilltops in the occupied Palestinian territories and build settlements on them. (WAFA 24 June 2023)
- A Palestinian young man sustained injuries tonight as hardcore Israeli settlers attacked Palestinian vehicles with stones at Ein Eyyub junction, to the west of Ramallah in the occupied West Bank, according to local sources. A group of Israeli settlers rampaged through Ein Ayyub junction, located near the village of Ras Karkar, and hurled stones at Palestinian vehicles driving through the junction, injuring Bahaa Absi, a 29-year-old Palestinian, in his head and face and causing damage to his vehicle. Absi was rushed to a nearby hospital for medical treatment. Earlier yesterday, several houses and vehicles were set on fire in a pogrom carried out by state-backed Israeli settler militias in the village of Umm Safa, to the north of Ramallah. (WAFA 24 June 2023)
- Israeli settlers set ablaze about 50 dunums of crops in the Palestinian village of al-Tuwane, in Masafer Yatta in the south of the West Bank. Israeli settlers from the illegal settlement of Havat Maon set fire to Palestinian crops in the village owned by three village residents causing the destruction of the crops. Settlers also let their sheep loose in Palestinian farms in Ein al-Bayda, in Masafer Yatta, seeking to destroy the crops. The settlers have intensified their attacks on Palestinian property, crops and pastures, and the demolition of wells and homes in their pursuit to expand their illegal settlement outposts at the expense of Masafer Yatta lands and residents. (WAFA 24 June 2023)
- In the West Bank Israeli paramilitary colonizers attacked Palestinian civilians and their property, burning Palestinian homes and vehicles. Armed paramilitary Israeli colonizers also invaded the Al-Aqsa mosque, the third-holiest site in Islam. In Saturday's attack, a group of armed Israeli paramilitary colonizers burned Palestinian homes and vehicles in the village of Umm Safa, north of Ramallah, under the protection of the Israeli

occupation forces, and fired live bullets at Palestinian homes and facilities. This marks the third straight day of Israeli paramilitary attacks on Palestinian town and villages, which included burning Palestinian homes and vehicles in over a dozen villages, burning the Muslim holy book 'The Quran' in an attempt to desecrate the religion practiced by most Palestinians, and attacking and brutalizing Palestinian civilians. (IMEMC 25 June 2023)

- The ongoing wave of state-backed Israeli settler terrorism continued for the second week in a row today, with reports of Israeli settlers setting fire to lands planted with crops in the town of Turmus Ayya, as well as brutally assaulting a Palestinian young man in the province of Salfit, according to local sources. In the village of Zawiya, in the occupied West Bank province of Salfit, rampaging Israeli settlers savagely assaulted a Palestinian young man and tried to amputate his finger, according to the sources. Settlers also rampaged through the entrances of several villages and the towns in the Salfit province, but there were no reports of injuries among Palestinian civilians. In Ramallah province, state-backed Israeli settler militias set fire to nearly six dunums of Palestinian-owned lands planted with wheat in the town of Turmus Ayya. Naeem Abu Marzouk, a member of the Turmus Ayya Municipality, told Wafa that a group of Israeli settlers from a nearby illegal outpost set fire to wheat-planted lands owned by a Palestinian farmer from the adjacent village of Al-Mughayir. Attacks and acts of terrorism against Palestinians by Israeli settler militias have seen a terrible rise across the occupied West Bank, including Jerusalem, since last week with a green light from the far-right Israeli government. One Palestinian was murdered in cold blood last week and many others were injured in a savage attack by armed Israeli settlers on the town of Turmus Ayya. (Wafa 25 June 2023)
- Israeli colonial settlers wrote racist slogans on the walls of greenhouses in the vicinity of the Shufa military checkpoint, southeast of Tulkarem. Farmer Tahsin Hamed told a correspondent with the Palestinian Wafa news agency that a group of armed paramilitary settlers infiltrated the lands surrounding the checkpoint, and wrote racist slogans calling for the killing of Arabs, on greenhouses belonging to farmers Ahmed and Mueen Muhammad Hamed from Izbat Shufa . The settlers stole two donkeys belonging to him and his brother Jamal. (IMEMC 25 June 2023)

- Israeli settlers sprayed racist graffiti on the walls of agricultural green homes in the vicinity of the Shufa Israeli military checkpoint to the southeast of Tulkarem, according to a local farmer. The farmer, Tahseen Hamed, stated that a group of settlers snuck into Palestinian-owned land in the vicinity of the said checkpoint and spray-painted racist slogans calling for the killing of Arabs on the walls of greenhouses owned by two residents. Settlers also stole a donkey owned by Hamed and his brother. (Wafa 25 June 2023)
- Groups of police-guarded fanatic Israeli settlers broke into the courtyards of the Al-Aqsa Mosque compound in occupied Jerusalem, according to witnesses. Scores of Israeli settlers entered the compound through the Moroccan Gate in groups and performed rituals there under the protection of Israeli police officers. (Wafa 25 June 2023)
- In order to steal the land and build a settlement, Israeli settlers set up tents on lands belonging to the village of Deir Sharaf, west of the northern West Bank city of Nablus. Israeli settlers, under the protection of the Israeli army, set up tents on land between the villages of Deir Sharaf, Sebastiya and Burqa, on the road between Nablus and Tulkarm. The settlers, chased shepherds off the lands and threatened to shoot them if they stayed there. (Wafa 26 June 2023)
- Israeli colonizers assaulted several Palestinian shepherds, wounding three, including a child, in the Al-Mo'arrajat area, northwest of Jericho in the northeastern West Bank. The colonizers chased and assaulted several shepherds and threatened to shoot them if they did not leave the grazing area in their community. The colonizers injured Jamal Mleihat, Ibrahim Mleihat, and the ten-year-old Abdul-Hai Mleihat. (IMEMC 27 June 2023)
- Israeli settlers assaulted a Palestinian youth in Masafer Yatta in the south of the West Bank. Israeli settlers assaulted the youth in Umm Laikhous in Masafer Yatta causing him bruises all over his body. The youth was admitted to a hospital for treatment. Israeli government-sanctioned settlers' violence against Palestinians in the occupied territories has been on the rise without any one being held accountable. (Wafa 28 June 2023)
- Israeli settlers, protected by soldiers, attacked Palestinian residents in the village of Um al-Akhous in Masafer Yatta, in the south of the occupied West Bank, after the village residents and activists confronted the settlers who attempted to build tents on their lands. Ratib al-Jubour, coordinator of the Popular Committees to Resist the Wall and Settlements in South Hebron, told Wafa that the settlers came from the illegal settlements of

- Mitzpe Yair and Beni Yacov Dalia. The soldiers detained four siblings from the village and three Israeli and international anti-settlements activists after they confronted the settlers. Ten other people suffered bruises and cuts after being attacked by settlers and were treated at the location. (Wafa 28 June 2023)
- Dozens of army-guarded Israeli settlers rampaged through Nablus-Ramallah road in the occupied West Bank at the entrance to the town of Turmus Ayya, to the north of Ramallah, according to local sources. Lafi Shalabi, the mayor of the town, told Wafa that dozens of settlers from the colonial Israeli settlements of Eli and Shilo, illegally built on Palestinian lands near the town, briefly blocked the main Nablus-Ramallah road, also known as Route 60, outside the town, forcing Palestinian vehicles to use longer alternative roads. (Wafa 29 June 2023)
 - Hardcore Israeli settlers this evening attacked the Palestinian village of Dura al-Qarie, to the north of Ramallah in the occupied West Bank, according to local sources. Samer Diab, the mayor of the village told Wafa that dozens of Israeli settlers from the colonial Israeli settlement of Beit El, nearby, attacked homes and lands on the outskirts of the village, setting fire to lands. The fire was put off later by Palestinian firefighters.
 - No injuries were reported. This was the latest in a spate of attacks by Israeli settlers against Palestinians and their properties across the occupied West Bank, with incitement and support from the far-right Israeli government. (Wafa 29 June 2023)
 - Israeli colonizers and soldiers attacked many Palestinians and international peace activists south of Hebron, in the southern part of the occupied West Bank, before the army abducted four siblings and three international peace activists, including one Israeli, and injured ten. The colonizers, from the illegal Mitzpe Yair and Bnei Yacov Dalia illegal outposts, accompanied by many soldiers, started preparing to install tents on Palestinians in the Um Al-Akhwas village in Masafer Yatta. The locals and international peace activists intercepted the attack and attempted to remove the colonizers from the Palestinian lands before Israeli soldiers and colonizers attacked them, causing at least ten to suffer cuts and bruises. The soldiers detained three international peace activists, including one Israel. The soldiers abducted four Palestinian siblings; Ibrahim, Mohammad, Mahmoud, and Yousef Jihad Abu Sabha. (IMEMC 29 June 2023)
 - Israeli settlers sprayed racist graffiti on the walls of agricultural green homes in the vicinity of the Shufa Israeli military checkpoint to the

southeast of Tulkarem, according to a local farmer. The farmer, Tahseen Hamed, told Wafa correspondent that a group of settlers snuck into Palestinian-owned land in the vicinity of the said checkpoint and spray-painted racist slogans calling for the killing of Arabs on the walls of greenhouses owned by two residents. Settlers also stole a donkey owned by Hamed and his brother. (Wafa 30 June 2023)

Home Demolition & Demolition threats

- Israeli occupation authorities forced a Palestinian owner to self-demolish his own house in occupied Jerusalem neighborhood of Um Tuba, citing unpermitted construction as a pretext. Witnesses told Wafa that Ibrahim Abu Teir, the owner, demolished his own house after being pressed into doing so by the all-Israeli municipality. Abu Teir had no choice but to do so in order to avoid paying exorbitant fees to the Israeli municipality in the event that its crews carried out the demolition on their own. (Wafa 2 June 2023)
- A Palestinian family from Umm Tuba village, southeast of occupied East Jerusalem, was forced to demolish its home after repeated appeals failed to save their home. Ibrahim Abu Teir stated that he and his family had to remove all their furniture and belongings from the property before demolishing the 90 square meters home. The decision to self-demolish the property wasn't lightly made but would spare the family further penalties, excessive fines and fees, and demolition costs if the City Council in occupied Jerusalem demolished the home using its workers and equipment. Ibrahim's wife is pregnant, and the family eagerly awaits their twins' birth after a long wait in the home they built on their land fifteen years ago. Abu Teir had been paying fines for many years. He had already paid about 250,000 Shekels despite all legal efforts to license the building under existing law retroactively. (IMEMC 3 June 2023)
- Five Palestinian families from the Wadi Qaddoum neighborhood in Silwan, south of the Al-Aqsa Mosque in the occupied capital, Jerusalem, were forced to empty their homes ahead of their demolition by Israel. The families of Tawil, Nassar, and Burqan had to vacate five homes and remove the furniture, windows, doors, and all essentials from their properties after receiving the final demolition orders. The families built their homes in 2001 and 2016 and have since been paying fines and fees to the City council, but Israel issued a ruling in late 2022 authorizing the demolitions and using

their lands for what it called “public projects.” The families initially managed to get an injunction temporarily freezing the demolitions, but an Israeli court granted a green light for the demolitions and told the families they must demolish their homes at their expense or face excessive fines and fees in addition to demolition costs if the City Council destroys the buildings using its workers and equipment. (IMEMC 5 June 2023)

- Israeli soldiers demolished a Palestine home and a barn in the Wad Al-Jouz neighborhood in occupied Jerusalem, in the West Bank. Several military vehicles and bulldozers invaded the neighborhood after the army surrounded it and demolished a home owned by the local Totah family. Twelve family members lived in the 120 square-meter home and the soldiers also demolished the wall surrounding the property and the family’s barn where they kept their horses, in addition to uprooting many trees on their land. (IMEMC 6 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers invaded the Al-Mazra’a Al-Gharbiya town northwest of Ramallah in the central West Bank and demolished a Palestinian home. A large military force, accompanied by bulldozers, invaded the Ein Al-Haramiyya area in the town after surrounding and isolating it. The army forced the family of Ghazi Shreiteh out of their property and demolished the 100-square-meter home. The family did not receive a demolition order from the army and, therefore, had no legal recourse to contest the demolition order and file an appeal. The property is in Area C of the West Bank, near an illegal Israeli colonialist outpost installed on stolen Palestinian lands. (IMEMC 6 June 2023)
- The Israeli occupation forces seized a Palestinian house in the town of Zeita, north of the northern West Bank city of Tulkarm, and turned it into a military outpost. Sources close to the family told Wafa that the occupation forces stormed the three-story house at midnight last night, forced the 14 members of the family to stay in one apartment, and seized the apartment keys and mobile phones. The soldiers informed the family, verbally and without showing any official papers or orders, that they would stay in the house for three days. The family appealed to the Red Cross and humanitarian and human rights organizations to intervene urgently to get the soldiers out of their house where children, women and old people live, especially since this is not the first time that the house has been raided and members of the family arrested under the pretext of its proximity to the

- annexation and racial segregation wall west of the town. (WAFA 6 June 2023)
- Five Palestinian families were forced to self-demolish their own homes in Wadi Qaddoum area of the East Jerusalem neighborhood of Silwan under the pretext the homes were built without a permit, displacing at least 30 people. Members of the Burqan, Tawil and Nassar families proceeded to tear down the two buildings that house their apartments after receiving demolition orders from the West Jerusalem Israeli municipality for construction without a permit. The municipality warned them that unless they demolish their own apartments, the municipality will carry out the demolition and force them to pay exorbitant costs plus \$50,000 in fines. Asem Burqan, one of the owners, said the two buildings house 30 people living in five apartments. He said the families tried for 28 years to get a permit for the two buildings but got only a permit for one floor. He said the Israeli municipality wants the two buildings demolished in order to take over the land they were built on it. (WAFA 6 June 2023)
 - The Israeli municipality of West Jerusalem demolished a Palestinian-owned house in Wadi al-Joz neighborhood of occupied East Jerusalem under the pretext of construction without a permit. A large Israeli force surrounded the 120-square-meter house, owned by the Totah family, and sealed off the area as the municipality bulldozers proceeded to demolish it. As a result, eight people were displaced. In the demolition, the bulldozers tore down a wall and uprooted several trees planted in the yard, as well as a stable for horses owned by the same family. (WAFA 6 June 2023)
 - The Israeli occupation bulldozers demolished a Palestinian-owned house in al-Mazra'a al-Gharbieh, northwest of Ramallah, without any prior notice because it is located near a settlement, according to Bassam al-Khatib, mayor of al-Mazra'a al-Gharbieh. A large Israeli army force accompanied by several bulldozers demolished the 100-square-meter house built more than 20 years ago and owned by Asaad Ghazi Shreiteh because it is located near the Jewish settlement outpost known as Horsha, west of the town, without informing the owner of the intention to demolish it. (WAFA 6 June 2023)
 - Israeli soldiers uprooted at least fifty Palestinian olive trees and demolished a wall in Hizma town, northeast of occupied Jerusalem, in the West Bank. Several army vehicles, including bulldozers, invaded the Tablas area in the town before invading lands owned by Ali Qassem Khatib and uprooting fifty olive trees. The soldiers also demolished a wall surrounding four Dunams of land owned by Ahmad Mustafa Khatib in the same area and destroyed agricultural roads. Hizma is subject to request Israeli military

invasions and violations, including the demolition of homes and structures, the bulldozing of lands, and the repeated attack by the paramilitary colonizers. (MEMC 7 June 2023)

- Israeli occupation forces issued a demolition notice against a residential structure in the northern Jordan Valley, according to a local activist. Israeli forces delivered a demolition notice against a residential structure owned by a local Palestinian, citing ruining an archaeological site as a pretext. (Wafa 7 June 2023)
- The Israeli occupation military notified three Palestinian residents in Masafer Yatta, to the south of the southern occupied West Bank district of Hebron, of its intentions to demolish their homes. The forces stormed Haribat al-Nabi Bedouin community in Masafer Yatta and delivered the demolition notices against three inhabited homes, measuring between 70 and 100 square meters each. The demolition of the three homes will render around 20 people homeless. (Wafa 7 June 2023)
- Following an all-night raid of Ramallah and confrontations with youths, the Israeli occupation soldiers demolished this morning the apartment of the Palestinian prisoner Islam Froukh in the old town of Ramallah and injured six people in the process. A large army force composed of more than 100 vehicles raided Ramallah shortly before midnight and proceeded to the old town to demolish the Froukh home. Confrontations broke out with local youths and six people were injured, including three by live bullets to the waist, leg and arm, and the rest by rubber bullets or tear gas and all were reported in stable condition. Photojournalist, Moumen Sumrein, was hit in the head by a rubber bullet and reported in stable condition. At around 5:30 a.m., the army completed the demolition of the Froukh home, destroying it from the inside due to its location on the first floor of a four-story building displacing his parents and four sisters who lived in the apartment. Froukh was allegedly involved in the killing of two Israelis in Jerusalem and was arrested around the end of December of last year. (Wafa 8 June 2023)
- The Israeli occupation authorities notified a Palestinian family in Khirbet Ibzeiq village, northeast of Tubas, for military drills, according to an activist. The occupation forces notified the family of Adel Hroub, comprised of nine members, that they need to leave their dwelling June 12 from 12:00 PM to 6:00 PM to make room for military drills. Meanwhile, the occupation authorities ordered a halt on the construction of five residential structures in al-Burj community in the northern Jordan Valley. The

occupation forces barged their way into the community and handed three Palestinians stop-construction orders against their structures, under the flimsy pretext of unlicensed building. (Wafa 8 June 2023)

- Several Israeli military vehicles invaded Jenin, in the northern part of the occupied West Bank, leading to protests, and destroyed a power transformer. The soldiers fired many live rounds, gas bombs, and concussion grenades, striking a main power transformer and causing it to burn. Palestinian firefighters rushed to the area, but the soldiers stopped them before they reached the burning transformer and prevented them from approaching until the army withdrew. The soldiers also stormed and ransacked a store where electrical supplies are sold near the Interior Ministry Junction. Furthermore, Palestinian resistance fighters exchanged fire with the soldiers invading several parts of Jenin and detonated an explosive charge near a military vehicle. Furthermore, the army installed roadblocks around many villages and towns in the Jenin governorate, stopped and searched dozens of cars, and interrogated scores of Palestinians while inspecting their ID cards. (IMEMC 9 June 2023)
- Israeli occupation soldiers tore down a fence surrounding a farm in the village of Azzun Atme, to the south of Qalqilia in the occupied West Bank, according to local sources. An Israeli army force broke into the village and destroyed a 100-meter-long fence erected around a Palestinian-owned farm, under the pretext that the farm is located in an area classified as Area C, under full Israeli control. The farm belongs to Abdul-Rahim el-Sheikh, a local Palestinian resident. During the raid, the Israeli army forced staff of the village's municipal council to stop working on a land reclamation project in the village, under the pretext of lacking an Israeli permit. (Wafa 11 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers demolished a concrete wall surrounding a Palestinian agricultural land in Azzoun Atma village, south of Qalqilia, in the northwestern part of the occupied West Bank. Abdul-Rahim Sheikh owns the land. The soldiers demolished the 100 meters long and 3 meters high wall for being built without a license from the so-called "Civil Administration Office," the administrative branch of the illegal Israeli occupation, because it is local in Area C of the occupied West Bank. (IMEMC 12 June 2023)

- The Israeli occupation authorities destroyed a road, a shack and a water well in the town of Hizma, northeast of occupied Jerusalem. Israeli forces accompanied a bulldozer into the northern area of the Palestinian town where the bulldozer destroyed a road built by the town's municipality in 2014 and paved in 2018 to connect its various neighborhoods, and demolished a shack and a water well in the same area owned by two different residents under the pretext they were built without a permit. (Wafa 12 June 2023)
- The Israeli occupation forces prevented Palestinian workers from the Beit Ummar municipality, north of Hebron, from repairing a water pipeline on the main Bethlehem-Hebron road and seized vehicles, according to a local activist. The forces seized a bulldozer and a vehicle owned by the Beit Ummar municipality and held the workers while repairing the water pipeline, claiming the workers did not have a permit to work on the road. (Wafa 12 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers invaded Hizma town, northeast of the occupied capital Jerusalem, in the West Bank, bulldozed a street, and demolished a room and water well. Several military vehicles, including bulldozers, invaded the northern area of Hizma and bulldozed a street linking several neighborhoods in the town. The Town Council was first prepared in 2014 and was paved in 2018, but the army went ahead and destroyed it. The soldiers also demolished a room made of wood and a water well in the same area, owned by Fares Al-Omari and Awwad Asakra. (IMEMC 13 June 2023)
- The Israeli occupation forces demolished a car scrap yard in the village of al-Dyouk al-Tahta in Jericho, east of the West Bank, and removed more than 100 vehicles. Shafiq Rawag, the owner of the yard, said that the occupation forces, accompanied by a bulldozer, stormed the village and demolished the four-dunum yard where more than 100 vehicles were kept. The occupation forces claimed they demolished his lot under the pretext it is located in an area classified as C, which is under full Israeli military control. (Wafa 13 June 2023)
- The Israeli occupation forces demolished a Palestinian-owned carwash located at an intersection near Shufat refugee camp in occupied East Jerusalem, according to local sources. The carwash, which belongs to a local family, was demolished under the pretext of construction without a permit. (Wafa 13 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers demolished a car salvage facility in Dyouk At-Tahta village near Jericho, in the northeastern West Bank. Shafiq Rawwa', the facility's

- owner, said several army jeeps and a bulldozer invaded the village and demolished the facility with about 100 salvaged cars on approximately four Dunams of land in the Steih area. The army told him they demolished the property because it is in Area C of the occupied West Bank, under full Israeli control. (IMEMC 13 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers demolished a Palestinian home in Beit Jala city, west of Bethlehem, in the occupied West Bank. Media sources said a large military force invaded the Be'er Owna area after surrounding and isolating it. The soldiers then demolished a 150-square-meter one-story home owned by Maher Rezeq Zreina. The army alleges that the home was built without a permit from the so-called "Civil Administration Office," the administrative branch of the illegal Israeli occupation. It is worth mentioning that the demolition is the fifth, but the family keeps rebuilding on its land. Be'er Awna is subject to frequent Israeli violations, including the demolition of homes and property and the bulldozing of Palestinian lands due to Israel's ongoing illegal colonialist activities. (IMEMC 15 June 2023)
 - The Israeli occupation army surrounded Rafidya neighborhood in Nablus in order to demolish the home of Usama Tawil, who was arrested on February 13. Hours later, the army demolished the 150-square-meter Tawil home, located in a four-story building, displacing his parents and a sister who lived in the house. The soldiers removed all residents from the building before demolishing the Tawil home in Nablus. 170 people were treated from suffocation due to the heavy tear gas fired by the soldiers during the raid. One of its ambulances was hit by a tear gas canister and another was shot at by the soldiers to prevent it from reaching the area to evacuate the wounded. (WAFA 15 June 2023)
 - The Israeli occupation authorities demolished a Palestinian-owned house in the Bethlehem-area city of Beit Jala claiming it was built without a permit, according to a local activist. A large army force broke into the Beir Oneh area of Beit Jala and demolished a 150-square-meter, one-story house owned by Maher Zarineh under the pretext it was built without a permit. This is the fifth time the Israeli occupation demolishes a Zarineh house in the same area. (WAFA 15 June 2023)
 - The Israeli occupation forces stormed the town of Yabad, southwest of Jenin, bulldozed a new road that connects the town with one of its suburbs, and raided the Yabad Electricity Authority building and nearby houses while destroying two vehicles. The mayor of Yabad, Amjad Atatreh, told

Wafa that the occupation bulldozers destroyed and closed the new 200-meter-long street used by school and university students and farmers, raided the Electricity Authority building and nearby houses and searched them while interrogating the employees and residents, and caused material damage to two vehicles. The forces also set up military observation points on the roofs of the houses. The army imposed a military siege on the town earlier this week, closed all access roads with dirt and checkpoints, and prevented people from entering or leaving the town, disrupting the sitting of high school students for the final matriculation exams, the tawjihi. (Wafa 15 June 2023)

- Israeli occupation forces ordered a halt on the construction of a house and confiscated a bagger in Masafer Yatta area, south of Hebron in the occupied West Bank, according to local sources. Israeli occupation forces ordered a halt on the ongoing construction of a house and confiscated a bagger in Al-Zuwedin village in Masafer Yatta. The area where the construction was ordered to stop is located within the jurisdiction of the Al-Zuwedin village council, and that this was the first such order in the area. Located in Area C of the West Bank, under full Israeli administrative and military control, the area has been subjected to repeated Israeli violations by settlers and soldiers, including home demolitions, attacks on civilians and forced expulsion. (Wafa 17 June 2023)
- Israeli occupation court issued a decision to demolish the Umm Qassah Mixed Elementary School, in Badia Yatta, south of the occupied West Bank city of Hebron. The school principal, Youssef Al-Basaita, stated that the occupation had notified the school last year of the demolition and prevented the residents from adding new classroom units to it, indicating that it consists of tin rooms, and houses 58 male and female students from the first to the fourth grades of primary school, noting that it also includes a kindergarten. Al-Basaita added that the occupation court informed the school's lawyer of the decision to demolish it within seven days. (Wafa 18 June 2023)
- The Israeli occupation forces issued a halt on construction against two agricultural roads and three houses in the town of Qarawat Bani Hassan, west of the occupied West Bank city of Salfit. Local sources told Wafa that the occupation forces stormed the town and ordered a halt on construction on two agricultural roads located in the Al-Oqda area, west of the town, and three houses owned by three local residents. (Wafa 18 June 2023)

- Israeli soldiers demolished a Palestinian home in Silwan town, south of the Al-Aqsa Mosque, in occupied Jerusalem in the West Bank. Several army and police vehicles invaded the Al-Abbasiyya neighborhood in Silwan after isolating it. The soldiers closed all streets leading to the home, prevented the Palestinians from entering it, and occupied rooftops to use as monitoring towers. The Israeli soldiers demolished a two-story home owned by Palestinians from the local Taqwil family, allegedly for being built without a permit. The soldiers also stopped journalists and prevented them from entering the area to document the invasion and the demolition. (IMEMC 20 June 2023)
- Bulldozers from the Israeli municipality of West Jerusalem demolished a Palestinian-owned house in the occupied section of the city under the pretext of construction without a permit, according to local sources. The bulldozers began in the morning tearing down a two-story house owned by the Tawil family in Silwan neighborhood. Israeli police, providing protection to the municipality staff, closed off the area of the house and prevented people from reaching it as the bulldozers proceeded to demolish the house. Palestinians in the city are forced to build on their lands without a permit because getting one is an almost impossible task from a far-right Israeli municipality that openly discriminates against the city's 350,000 indigenous Palestinian population and favors settling it with Jews. (WAFSA 20 June 2023)
- The Israeli occupation forces issued demolition orders against three houses, a shed, and a paved road in the town of al-Karmel, in the South Hebron Hills, according to a local activist. The so-called Israeli military government's Planning and Administration Authority, accompanied by an army force, stormed an area of al-Karmel and handed demolition orders to three local residents against their houses. One order affected a 160-square-meter house that is still in the construction phase, a 70-square-meter house where seven people live, and a 100-square-meter where a family lives. The forces also handed a demolition order against an agricultural shed, as well as a recently paved road that serves the area communities. (WAFSA 20 June 2023)
- The Israeli occupation forces issued demolition orders against three houses, a shed, and a paved road in the town of al-Karmel, in the South Hebron Hills, according to a local activist. The so-called Israeli military government's Planning and Administration Authority, accompanied by an army force, stormed an area of al-Karmel and handed demolition orders to

three local residents against their houses. One order affected a 160-square-meter house that is still in the construction phase, a 70-square-meter house where seven people live, and a 100-square-meter where a family lives. The forces also handed a demolition order against an agricultural shed, as well as a recently paved road that serves the area communities. (IMEMC 20 June 2023)

- Bulldozers from the Israeli municipality of West Jerusalem demolished a Palestinian-owned house in the occupied section of the city under the pretext of construction without a permit, according to local sources. The bulldozers began in the morning tearing down a two-story house owned by the Tawil family in Silwan neighborhood. Israeli police, providing protection to the municipality staff, closed off the area of the house and prevented people from reaching it as the bulldozers proceeded to demolish the house. (Wafa 20 June 2023)
- Israeli occupation authorities demolished two rooms built on the roof of a building in At-Tur neighborhood of occupied East Jerusalem. Large Israeli police forces stormed the neighborhood of At-Tur, cordoned off the house, and forced Palestinian residents away before tearing down two rooms erected on the roof of a residential building citing unpermitted construction as a pretext. In the meantime, a large Israeli force, accompanied by bulldozers, raided Shufaat refugee camp to the northeast of Jerusalem and knocked down a wall there. (Wafa 21 June 2023)
- Dozens of Israeli soldiers invaded Nablus city, in the northern part of the occupied West Bank, before wiring and detonating an apartment for the family of a Palestinian detainee. The soldiers, including the Israeli Combat Engineering Corps, invaded the city before storming the family home of detainee Kamal Jouri and forcing them out of their property. The soldiers wired the property on the second floor of a residential building on Tal Street and detonated it. The detonated property was 130 square meters, providing shelter for five family members. The invasion started on Wednesday night and led to protests before the soldiers shot a young man with a gas bomb in the leg, and caused at least 165 to suffer the effects of tear gas inhalation. The soldiers also caused damage to one Palestinian ambulance after targeting it with a high-velocity gas bomb. It is worth mentioning that the soldiers abducted Jouri on February 16, 2023, and accused him of killing an Israeli soldier in November of last year. (IMEMC 22 June 2023)
- The Israeli occupation forces at dawn this morning blew up the family house of the prisoner Kamal Jouri in the northern West Bank city of Nablus.

The 130-square-meters house is located on the second floor of a residential building and houses five people. Jouri was arrested on the 13th of February on allegations he took part in the killing of an Israeli soldier in the West Bank in October of last year. A large Israeli army force stormed the neighborhood in Nablus where the house is located and evacuated two buildings in the vicinity of the Jouri home before blowing it up hours later. Confrontations broke out between Palestinians and Israeli soldiers during the raid. The ambulance crews dealt with 165 cases of suffocation as a result of the toxic gas fired by the soldiers, one of whom was transferred to the hospital, and a young man was injured by a gas bomb in the foot. An ambulance was also directly hit by a gas bomb, causing damage to it. (Wafa 22 June 2023)

- The Israeli occupation forces demolished homes in Hamamt al-Maleh in the northern Jordan Valley. Mahdi Daraghmeh, head of the al-Maleh village council, said that the Israeli occupation forces began demolishing the houses of the two brothers, Mohammed and Abdul Rahman Rashid, which consist of four residential rooms made of bricks and tin. It is worth noting that many areas of the northern Jordan Valley are witnessing an escalation in demolition orders recently. (Wafa 22 June 2023)
- The Israeli occupation authorities leveled agricultural land, demolished a shed, and uprooted trees in Umm Tuba neighborhood in occupied East Jerusalem, according to local sources. The occupation forces stormed the neighborhood accompanying a bulldozer and proceeded to level a plot of land, uprooted a number of trees planted by a local resident, and demolished a shed for sheep and cattle. (Wafa 22 June 2023)
- The Israeli occupation forces bulldozed stone chains and a large area of land planted with trees in Masafer Bani Naim, east of the southern West Bank city of Hebron. The occupation forces, accompanied by bulldozers, raided the village and bulldozed stone chains and lands planted with forest and fruit trees owned by two local families. The land has an area of more than 10 dunums, and it is located near the illegal Bani Hefer settlement, built on village lands. (Wafa 26 June 2023)

Israeli Military Orders

- Israeli soldiers confiscated seventy Dunams of Palestinian lands from Azzoun Atma village, isolated behind the illegal Annexation Wall, south of Qalqilia in the northwestern part of the occupied West Bank. The army issued military orders confiscating the lands from their owners in Azzoun

Atma and nearby Masha village in the Salfit governorate. The orders target Palestinian olive orchards in the Khallet Abu Atma area, intending to build 192 new units for the illegal colonizers in the Shaare Tikva colony, built on stolen Palestinian lands. (IMEMC 13 June 2023)

Confiscation & Razing of lands

- Israeli soldiers invaded, Thursday, a Palestinian land in the Al-Mughayyir village, northeast of the central West Bank city of Ramallah, and handed an annexation order of five Dunams owned by a Palestinian at the village's eastern entrance. The soldiers invaded his land and handed him the annexation order for what the army called military purposes. The army wants to build a military tower on his land to observe the village's eastern area, which could also lead to further annexations and severe restrictions on the Palestinians. In related news, the army handed Rezeq Abu Naim an order halting the construction of a barn and an agricultural structure on his land in the same area. It is worth mentioning that the village's eastern entrance remains closed by the army for the twentieth day. (IMEMC 1 June 2023)
- Israeli forces this evening seized two dunums of land from the town of al-Khader, south of the southern occupied West Bank district of Bethlehem, according to local activist Ahmad Salah. The activist told Wafa correspondent that Israeli forces seized two dunums of land belonging to the heirs of a local family in the said town and gave them a period of 45 days to object. (Wafa 4 June 2023)
- Israeli several Israeli military vehicles, including bulldozers, invaded Palestinian agricultural lands east of Khan Younis and east of Beit Hanoun in the besieged Gaza Strip. At least five armored D9 bulldozers and two Merkava Israeli tanks advanced dozens of meters into the Palestinian lands near Abasan Al-Kabira and Khuza'a town, east of Khan Younis, in the southern part of the coastal region. The soldiers bulldozed lands near the perimeter fence and installed sandhills. The army also invaded Palestinian agricultural lands near the fence, east of Beit Hanoun, in northern Gaza and bulldozed sections near the fence. (IMEMC 5 June 2023)
- The Israeli occupation authorities seized land and a tractor in the north of the West Bank. The Israeli military authorities announced that it has seized more than 42 dunums of Palestinian-owned land in the villages of Sarta and

- Brouqin, in the Salfit governorate. While Israel claimed it seized the land for what it said was “public interest”, the real reason, he said, is to expand the settlement road known as Highway 5 to serve the settlement of Beduel built on Salfit lands. Meanwhile, Israeli forces seized a tractor and detained its driver after breaking into an area east of Beit Furik, east of the city of Nablus. The tractor was working on land reclamation when the Israeli forces seized it. (Wafa 5 June 2023)
- Israeli bulldozers Wednesday continued to raze Palestinian land close to Sinjil town, north of the occupied West Bank city of Ramallah, according to local sources. Israeli occupation forces continued digging a tract of 25 donums of land belonging to the Palestinian villagers for the third consecutive day, laying the groundwork for the expansion of the nearby encroaching colonial settlement of Givat Haroeh. In late February, the Israeli occupation authorities advanced a plan to legalize nine colonial settlement outposts, including Givat Haroeh, and construct some additional 10,000 settler units in West Bank colonial settlements. As part of the plan, the occupation authorities envisage connecting Givat Haroeh with four settlements in the area. (Wafa 8 June 2023)
 - Israeli occupation authorities Thursday evening notified the villagers of Az-Zawiya, west of the occupied West Bank city of Salfit, of the intention to seize a large tract of their land, according to a municipal source. Mayor of Az-Zawiya, Mohammad Raddad, said that he was handed an Israeli military order, notifying him and the villagers of the occupation authorities’ decision to take over 96 donums, already isolated by Israel’s apartheid and annexation wall. He pointed that over 8,000 donums of the villagers’ land already isolated by the wall are now under the full control of the occupation authorities, which designated them for the benefit of colonial settlement construction. (Wafa 9 June 2023)
 - The Israeli occupation authorities issued a decision to seize Palestinian land located beyond the segregation wall in the Qalqilya area in the north of the West Bank for the benefit of a nearby illegal settlement. Local sources told Wafa that the Israeli authorities decided to seize 70 dunums of land planted with olive trees that belong to Palestinians from the villages of Azoun Atmeh and Masha located beyond the segregation barrier in order to build 192 housing units in the illegal settlement of Shari Tiqva. (Wafa 13 June 2023)
 - Israeli soldiers invaded and bulldozed large areas of Palestinian lands, including many trees and retaining walls, in Masafer Bani Naim, east of Hebron, in the occupied West Bank’s southern part. The army brought many vehicles, including armored bulldozers, and started bulldozing the

lands and demolishing the retaining walls. The uprooted privately-owned lands contained evergreens and fruitful trees planted by Palestinians from the local Manasra and Tarayra families. The lands, approximately 10 Dunams, are near the illegal Bnei Hever colony, built on stolen Palestinian lands. (IMEMC 26 June 2023)

- Israeli occupation bulldozers Monday evening leveled large tracts of Palestinian land belonging to the villagers of Qaryout, south of the occupied West Bank city of Nablus, according to a local activist. Seven Israeli military machinery razed large tracts of the villagers land to make room for the expansion of the nearby encroaching colonial settlements of Eli and Shilo. (wafa 26 June 2023)

Expansion of Israeli settlements



- the Israeli occupation authorities approved the construction of 5,623 new colonial settlement units in the occupied West Bank. This move comes in the midst of a nearly week-long wave of Israeli colonial settler violence against Palestinians that has included burning Palestinian villages, beating children, burning Muslim holy books, invading mosques and uprooting Palestinian olive trees. Monday's approval includes plans for the construction of 4,291 new settlement units which are already in an advanced stage of the planning and construction stages. It also includes submitting 1,332 new building plans for approval. According to the Israeli media, 1,000 new settlement units, more than what the occupation government had approved last week, have also been approved. They will be built in the "Eli" settlement built on citizens' lands south of Nablus, to be added to the plans. (IMEMC 26 June 2023)
- Israeli occupation authorities approved the construction of 5,623 new colonial settler units in the occupied West Bank. The approval includes depositing plans for the construction of 4,291 new colonial settler units, which constitutes an advanced stage of the planning and construction stages by the occupation authorities prior to issuing tenders for the implementation of construction projects. It also includes submitting 1,332 building plans for approval after holding a session for hearing objections, before final approval and preparation of tenders. 1,000 new colonial settler units, more than what the occupation government had approved last week, have been approved. They will be built in the "Eli" colonial

settlement, south of Nablus, to be added to the plans, in line with an agreement between Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, "Defense" Minister Yoav Gallant, and Finance Minister Bezalel Smotrich. (Wafa 26 June 2023)

Israeli Closures

- While the entrances to the village remain closed for the 20th day in a row, the Israeli occupation forces notified residents of the village of al-Mughayyer, northeast of Ramallah, of seizing a plot of land and halting construction on an agricultural facility. Local sources told Wafa that the occupation forces stormed the village and handed a local resident a notice for seizing five dunums from his land located at the army-sealed eastern entrance to the village, citing the construction of a military watchtower as the reason. The Israeli forces handed another resident a notice to halt construction on an agricultural facility and a shed for sheep he was building in the eastern part of the village under the pretext of not obtaining a building permit. The occupation forces continue the siege on the village for the 20th day in a row in a collective punishment move and this morning detained three people during a raid of the village. (Wafa 1 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers closed the Beit Furik military roadblock and invaded the eastern Nablus area in the northern part of the occupied West Bank. The soldiers closed the military roadblock near Beit Furik town, southeast of Nablus, and forced the Palestinians to leave. Furthermore, the soldiers invaded the eastern area of Nablus city and initiated massive searches. The Israeli army claimed Palestinian resistance fighters opened fire at the soldiers who responded to the source of fire before closing the roadblock. (MEMC 3 June 2023)
- Israeli soldiers closed one of the two main entrances of the Al-Mughayir village, east of the central West Bank city of Ramallah, just two days after opening it; the second main entrance was never opened. The village's two entrances were closed for nineteen days before the soldiers reopened, the western entrance but kept the eastern entrance closed. The soldiers prevented the Palestinians from entering or leaving the village, forcing them to take longer, unpaved streets. The army also handed Nael Rashid Al-Haj Mohamad an order to annex five Dunams of his land near the village's eastern entrance to build a fortified military tower. In addition, the soldiers handed Rezeq Abu Naim a military order to stop the construction

of a barn and an agricultural shed on his land at the eastern entrance of Al-Mughayir. (IMEMC 3 June 2023)

- The Israeli occupation forces continued for the fourth week in a row today blocking the two main entrances to al-Mughayyir village, east of Ramallah, prohibiting residents from entering or leaving it and forcing them to take other rough dirt roads to get to their destinations. The two main entrances to the village have been completely blocked by the Israeli occupation army, while the third entrance to the village has been getting blocked by army from 6:30 to 14:00 every day during the past three weeks. Those leaving or entering the village for their workplaces and for any other purposes have been left with no choice but to drive through bumpy dirt roads as a result of the arbitrary Israeli closures. (Wafa 4 June 2023)
- Israeli occupation forces sealed off the secondary access roads to Ya'bad town, southwest of the occupied West Bank city of Jenin, according to security and local sources. The heavily-armed soldiers used a bulldozer to erect earth mounds at the road linking Ya'bad with the nearby Imreiha village in addition to other secondary roads leading to the town, further tightening access to the town. Israeli severely restricts Palestinians' freedom of movement through a complex combination of approximately 100 fixed checkpoints, flying checkpoints, settler-only roads and various other physical obstructions. (Wafa 13 June 2023)
- For the second day in a row, the Israeli occupation forces continued to seal off all access roads to the town of Yabad, southwest of the northern occupied West Bank city of Jenin, and shut down the two nearby military checkpoints, according to Palestinian security and local sources. They told Wafa that in addition to sealing off the access roads, the soldiers raided several homes and shops in the town and seized surveillance cameras. The closure of the roads disrupted sitting for the matriculation exams, the *tawjihi*, for 360 high school students in Yabad, forcing the Education Ministry to open halls in other towns to accommodate students from outside Yabad prevented by soldiers from reaching the town to sit for the exams. After closing all access roads, people were not able to enter or leave the town and the *tawjihi* students sitting for vocational or industrial exams were not able to leave the town to sit for these exams in the nearby city of Jenin. (Wafa 14 June 2023)
- The Israeli occupation forces impeded the movement of people at Dotan checkpoint outside the northern West Bank town of Yabad, southwest of Jenin, and prevented farmers from reaching their lands, according to the mayor of Yabad, Amjad Atatreh. He told Wafa that the occupation forces,

- stationed at the Dotan military checkpoint, stopped and searched vehicles, and checked the identities of the passengers, which impeded their movement. The occupation forces are still preventing farmers from entering their lands located on the main road linking Jenin, Tulkarm and Yabad, adjacent to the Dotan checkpoint, after closing it with earth mounds. The occupation forces intensified their military presence around Yabad and set up flying checkpoints in its vicinity. It is worth noting that the occupation forces yesterday and a few days ago bulldozed agricultural land as well as side roads leading to the town of Yabad, along the Dotan military camp and the main street linking Jenin to Yabad and Tulkarm. (WAFA 17 June 2023)
- Israeli occupation forces this evening closed the main northern entrance to Ramallah, known as the DCO checkpoint, and prevented the movement of Palestinian cars in and out of the city. The Israeli forces shut down the DCO checkpoint in both directions, causing a heavy traffic jam. The DCO checkpoint is normally congested with Palestinians entering or leaving the de facto Palestinian capital. (WAFA 20 June 2023)
 - Israeli occupation forces this evening sealed off the entrances of various villages and towns in Salfit. Forces closed the metal gates and checkpoints placed at the entrances of the towns and villages of Deit Istiya, Marda, Kafr ad-Dik, and Kifl Haris, obstructing Palestinians' movement and preventing them from reaching their homes. (WAFA 20 June 2023)
 - Israeli forces Thursday evening sealed off the main entrance to Duma village, south of the occupied West Bank city of Nablus, according to a local official. The occupation soldiers used a bulldozer to erect earth mounds at the western entrance of the town. Meanwhile, the occupation soldiers closed the metal gate at the road linking Nahalin town to al-Jab'a village, southwest of Bethlehem, and opened fire towards the villagers of al-Jab'a who insisted on opening the road, forcing them to take long rough roads to reach their houses. Israeli severely restricts Palestinians' freedom of movement through a complex combination of approximately 100 fixed checkpoints, flying checkpoints, settler-only roads and various other physical obstructions. (WAFA 23 June 2023)
